COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

To the Life Governors and Contributors
Warrnambool Hospital and Benevolent Asylum.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Sixty-nine years in the history of the Institution have just closed, during which period 10,364 patients have received treatment. Following the annual custom, your Committee have pleasure in submitting for your approval the Annual Report and Statement of accounts, duly audited for the year ending 30th June, 1923.

FINANCE.

We commenced the year with a Cr. Balance of £214/18/3, and closed with a Dr. of £182/3/1. Owing to the daily average being lower, the average cost per bed is higher, £114/3/0 $\frac{1}{4}$.

ADMISSIONS TO HOSPITAL.

In-patients, 480, (257 males, 223 females) were treated during the year. Out-patients' attendances totalled 933.

The daily average of the Hospital and Benevolent Asylum was 38.24.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

To Drs. E. J. Connell, J. H. Henderson, H. I. Holmes, A. H. Dunstan, F. E. Littlewood, and J. F. Patrick, special thanks are due for their valuable services to the Institution.

RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

Dr. A. R. Home was appointed and resigned during the year. His place was filled by Dr. H. Gault, who has also resigned.

Miss Peacock, from Albury, was appointed Matron during the year.

Nurses Rogers, Anderson, Boadle, and Craig were successful in passing their R.V.T.N.A. examination.

In the resignation of the late Vice-President, Mr. C. Rooney, the Committee lost a valuable member, loyal supporter, and one whose place will be hard to fill.

Mr. C. C. Cox also resigned as Hon. Treasurer, owing to his removal to Geelong.

The following members retire by effluxion of time and are eligible for re-election:—Messrs. A. Robinson, G. S. Mackay, J. Mainland, and J. King. It will also be necessary to fill the vacancies, caused through the resignation of Major A. Jordan, Messrs. C. Rooney, and C. C. Cox.

Messrs. T. W. Crothers, W. W. Johnstone, D. O'Keefe, W. A. Anderson also retire by effluxion of time and are eligible for re-election.

Mr. L. J. Weatherly resigned during the year. There will therefore be four vacancies to fill on the Country Committee, owing to the above resignation and through the deaths of Messrs. J. Munro, L. W. Farmer, and J. Anderson.

MARKET DAY.

The Market Day held on the 24th March again proved a great success, resulting in the funds being increased by nearly £1,800. This amount, added to what we already have in hand and promised brings the total up to £16,330/8/2, (including the Carson Bequest).

Our best thanks are due to many enthusiastic workers and an ever generous public for the above munificent response.

The cost of the proposed additions will be much greater than anticipated, and it will be necessary to continue our appeals in order to achieve the object of making the Hospital thoroughly equipped and complete in every respect.


OBITUARY.
