COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

To the Life Governors and Contributors
Warrnambool Hospital and Benevolent Asylum.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Committee of Management have pleasure in submitting for your approval the Annual Report and Statement of Accounts, duly audited, for the year ending 30th June, 1922.

FINANCE.

We commenced the year with a Dr. Balance of £380/8/8, and closed with a Cr. of £214/18/3. Owing to the daily average being a little less than last year the average cost per bed is slightly higher.

A Bequest from the Estate of the late Thomas Montgomery for £250, came to hand during the year, and the Government Grant has been increased by £50.

ADMISSIONS TO HOSPITAL.

In-patients, 516, (260 males, 256 females) received treatment during the year. Out-patients' attendances were 1060, being a record for the Institution.

The daily average of the Hospital and Benevolent patients was 43.39. There was a decrease of 20 admissions as compared with 1920-21.

HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

To Drs. E. J. Connell, J. H. Henderson, H. I. Holmes, A. H. Dunstan, F. E. Littlewood, J. F. Patrick, and J. G. Wilson, special thanks are due for the valuable services to the Institution.

RESIDENT MEDICAL OFFICER.

Dr. Duncan resigned in the early part of the year and Dr. Danziger, who was then appointed, has also resigned.

The following members retire by effluxion of time and are eligible for re-election;—Messrs H. H. Smith, J. E. Bennett, and Major A. Jordan. It will also be necessary to fill the vacancy, caused through the resignation of Mr. S. G. Russell. The Committee lost the services of a highly esteemed and valued member when Mr. Russell resigned.

Messrs J. E. Vines and J. Anderson, Koroit, also retire by effluxion of time but are eligible for re-election.

The vacancy caused through the death of Mr. J. Munro, has not yet been filled, and it will also be necessary to fill the place of the late Mr. T. W. Farmer.

Matron Davidson has sent in her resignation, as she is retiring from Hospital work.

Nurses Blain, Dale, O'Keefe, and Glen were successful in passing their R.V.T.N.A. examination.

The Countess of Stradbroke when in Warrnambool in May, showed her deep and sympathetic interest in the patients of the Hospital, by having a surprise visit which was much appreciated by all, especially the returned soldiers whom she met on the occasion of her former visit.

It was decided to forego the March Hospital Day this year in honor of the Soldiers' Memorial Fund Appeal.

OBITUARY.

The Committee regret to record the death of one of its oldest members, in the person of Mr. S. G. Russell, who always took a keen and practical interest in the affairs of the Hospital.

Mr. T. W. Farmer, who for many years as a Country Member was a loyal supporter of the Institution, has also joined the great majority.

In conclusion, we desire to thank the "Warrnambool Standard" and all who have in any way assisted from time to time.
