

President's Report.

July 23rd., 1914.

To the Life Governors and Contributors

Warrnambool Hospital and Benevolent Asylum—

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,—

Your Committee have much pleasure in presenting for your consideration and adoption the various Balance Sheets and Reports for the year ending June 30th., 1914.

The number of cases treated in the Hospital was 395, being a decrease of 9, with a daily average of 25 as against 28 during 1913.

Although the number of cases treated is much about the same as previous year, the average number of days each patient was in Hospital is less.

The number of Benevolent Asylum inmates has been reduced to 36, being three less than last year, with a daily average of 23 as against 24 in 1913.

The daily average of Benevolent inmates is decreasing each year, possibly owing to the old-age pension allowance.

Turning to the financial aspect, the Maintenance Account at the beginning of the year showed a credit balance of £216/6/5, and ends with a credit balance of £680/8/—a highly satisfactory condition of affairs.

The total cash receipts is £3168/7/-, an increase of £172/17/9, and expenditure £2692/6/1, an increase of £127/1/7. The average cost per head per annum was £54/18/-, an increase of £6/4/7 per head.

It is to be regretted to note a further falling off in annual subscriptions, only £164/15/- being received from this source. Considering the population of the town, and the large district from which the Hospital receives patients, this sum the Committee consider small. On the other hand, it is pleasing to note an increase of £50 in the Patients' Contribution Account.

From proceeds of entertainments the sum of £800/14/- was received. This is an increase of £372/14/6 over the previous year, mainly due to the recent Hospital Bazaar, the nett proceeds of which was £725/16/5.
