## 98th ANNUAL REPORT

To the Life Governors and Contributors,  
Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Committee of Management has the honor to present the 98th Annual Report and Financial Statements for the period ending 31st March, 1952. During the year difficult problems of administration and financial uncertainty have been faced. It is pleasing to report that your Committee has managed to retain a very high standard of efficiency and the increasing demand on the hospital services has been met in a manner which we trust merits the goodwill of the community we serve.

### BUILDING PLANS

Work on the Nurses' Home is nearing completion and it is anticipated that the staff will be in occupancy early in 1953. The rate of progress was reduced prior to Christmas 1951 owing to shortage of finance, but fortunately this difficulty was temporarily overcome and work proceeded at a normal rate. All structural work has been completed, but the interior cement rendering, installation of steam, water and electric light services and lift will occupy some time. To follow this must come woodwork and furniture installation. The supply position is, however, satisfactory and no major hold up from this cause is anticipated.

Finance is still a cause for some concern, but as the building is nearing completion it is expected that the Government, through the Hospitals and Charities Commission, will appreciate the value of spending sufficient to place the home into commission even if it is at the expense of jobs just commenced. We were restricted to a Government expenditure of £30,000 for the year, to which we added more than our proportionate share to keep work to normal rate. Public support will be needed to open the home free of debt. The appeal for finance for furnishing has been successful to date. For the 74 nurses' bedrooms promises of £100 each have been received for furnishing 41 bedrooms, and for 5 sitting rooms three amounts of £250 each have been promised. Payment has been made in some cases and the balance is expected during the next few months. The amount per room was arrived at by an overall anticipated expenditure of £132 per room, of which the Government will pay only 25%. The large teaching section has to be furnished on similar percentage.

The Home will prove of inestimable value to the Hospital and the community generally by ensuring maximum comfort and utility for nurses' accommodation without any luxury. The accommodation for nurses at present is very sub-standard, and good conditions are essential to attract sufficient staff to fully service such a large hospital.

Our plan for modernising and extending our hospital building is unlikely to meet with progress owing to the present financial position. This is most discouraging to your Committee.

### CHARITIES COMMISSION

The Chairman (Mr C. L. McVilly) and members of the Commission have an unenviable task to reconcile the present financial stringency with the increasing demand for expansion of services and buildings. It is to be regretted that such restrictions appear necessary at a stage where the Commission have explored and sifted the hospital needs of the State and formulated plans for much needed improvements of an urgent nature.

Our own requirements for hospital expansion have been sympathetically considered by the Commission but are unlikely of immediate realisation.

It is realised that the problems of the Commission are very great and we appreciate the courtesy and assistance always extended to us during the year under review.

## PATIENTS

A total of 3961 in-patients were treated, each for an average of 12½ days. The daily average for the twelve months is 144.207, compared with 132.1 last year. This shows the steady increase in demand noticeable each year and the committee is concerned at the bed position of the future, unless building expansion is soon granted. The number of out-patients is 6290.

Other special departments show increases in numbers treated:—

whilst the number of in-patients having physiotherapy treatment is constantly on the increase.

## FINANCE

The Committee view with grave concern the financial future of hospitals in Victoria. Whilst our past year has been satisfactory because of the Government Grants and generous public support, the financial set up is unstable and gives a feeling of uncertainty and insecurity. Many controversial schemes are suggested by various bodies, each claiming their suggestion as the solution to hospital financial problems, but this committee considers the solution to be one of Government policy and a decision on such policy will be awaited. However, we do emphasise that in spite of such economy measures, rise in costs is alarming, and whilst community donations are of great assistance no more than 10% of total costs can be expected from such revenue, leaving a large percentage to be covered by patients' fees and Government Grants.

Maintenance expenditure for the year was £119,460, with income £119,528, showing a surplus of £68. Of this income Government Grants were £67,199 (56%), Government payment Tuberculosis Fees £10,541 (9%), Patients' Fees £33,270 (28%), and Charitable Contributions for maintenance £5,518 (5%), with odd items 2%.

Bed costs rose from 36/8 to 44/4 per day, which must be considered very satisfactory in view of general increases. A weekly cost per bed of £15/10/4 is much below the average of the hospitals of the State.

Government bed subsidy schemes do not materially assist the hospital, but are of assistance to patients who have to pay private or intermediate fees. A member of an approved Benefits Fund now receives 6/- (or more) from the Contributory Fund, plus 8/- Government Bed Subsidy, and an additional 4/- Commonwealth payment through the Contributory Fund — £6/6/0 in all. For patients not in Contributory Fund the hospital still receives 8/- Government Bed Subsidy only.

For public patients, 3/11 per day only is received.

### AUXILIARIES — DIVERSIONAL THERAPY — BLOOD TRANSFUSION SERVICE

Invaluable service has been given over the past year by our Warrnambool Base Hospital Auxiliary and extra comforts bought for patients have been much appreciated.

The Red Cross Diversional Therapy unit has worked diligently and through its efforts have given great pleasure and comfort to long stay patients. Rising costs of materials has reduced the range of craft material available, but a considerable range of attractive and useful craft work has been taught.

Two hundred and ten blood transfusions were given during the year and the Committee desires to place on record appreciation to the 400 donors on our lists available for urgent call at any time.

### COMMITTEE CHANGES

The following members of the Committee retire by effluxion of time and under By-Law 26, but are eligible for re-election, namely: Messrs Philpott, Taylor, Good, Ford, Dempster, Harvey.

It is to be regretted that through ill health Mr A. H. McMillan had to resign during the year and we wish to record appreciation for many years of valuable work.

## ADMINISTRATION STAFF

Smooth organisation of such a large institution as this hospital depends on teamwork and only by full co-operation is efficiency maintained. It is only by the tact and ability of Senior Executives that a working team can be first established and maintained to give maximum service to the community.

We greatly appreciate the service given by Matron D. A. Swinton and her nursing staff by providing such a very high standard of nursing. The comparatively few changes in Charge positions, combined with the encouraging intake of trainees, testify to the good name of Warrnambool as a well conducted hospital and an efficient training school.

It is fitting that a tribute should be paid to our Manager and Secretary, Mr S. A. Lindsay, for the excellent service he continues to render to this Institution. In addition to the ever-increasing demands on his time as a result of the steady growth of the Hospital, he has had to shoulder the responsibility for the reconstruction and management of "Alveston," and supervise the erection of the new Nurses' Home. These additional tasks he has accepted with a ready willingness, and with his usual efficiency. We are indeed fortunate to have such a splendid Manager.

## STAFF CHANGES

In November, Dr. Brian Minto and Dr. Colin Siegele were appointed Resident Medical Officers to succeed Drs. Henry and Laycock, who transferred to Melbourne Hospitals.

Sister M. Fotheringham resigned after seven years' excellent service as Sister in Charge Marcus Saltau General Floor and was succeeded by Sister E. Harbinson.

Sister J. Henderson commenced as Sister in Charge Operating Theatre to succeed Sister N. Carrick.

Sister Beavis succeeded Sister Bradley as Sister in Charge Children's Ward.

Sister Taylor, who had been in Charge Tuberculosis Chalet for one year, resigned owing to approaching marriage.

Mr Murray Clarke, Relieving Officer for the Western District and stationed at Warrnambool, accepted the position of Manager and Secretary of Tallangatta Hospital.

Mr Irving Absalom was appointed Clerk in the office with special duties at Alveston Annexe.

Two recent appointments as X-Ray Technicians were Mr W. Guiliano from Hamilton Hospital, and Miss M. Graham from St. Georges Hospital Clinic, Kew.

Miss Margaret Dron relinquished the position of Assistant Housekeeper owing to approaching marriage.

## SOUTH WESTERN DISTRICT HOSPITAL BENEFITS FUND

With changes in Government Policy with regard to Health Services, the activities of the Fund have expanded and during the year a large increase in membership was noticeable. Miss M. Hamilton, Secretary of the Fund, is most helpful to all requiring information on hospital matters.

## "ALVESTON" ANNEXE

In September, this private hospital was purchased by the Government from Sister Ingpen who had conducted the hospital for over 40 years, firstly as a private hospital and latterly as an old folks home. When the Government asked this Board to accept the responsibility of keeping open this avenue for aged patients, the Board accepted the obligation, realising that Warrnambool City and district could not manage without these 30 beds. The Government have provided the funds to thoroughly renovate and modernise "Alveston" and the beds available are in great demand, with a constant waiting list.

In the six months, a deficit of only £125 was incurred, and this is most satisfactory. Cost of maintaining each bed is £7/8/1 per week and no Government Grant was received to assist in maintenance.

Matron E. Smith has rendered invaluable service since her appointment, and she and her staff have cared for up to 29 patients daily in a most sympathetic and efficient way, accepting cheerfully the upsets caused by constant presence of building and painting staffs.

## HONORARY MEDICAL AND DENTAL STAFF

The record number of public in-patients treated indicates the demands made upon the Honorary Medical and Dental Officers. However, these duties have been carried out at all times in a very willing and unselfish manner. Warrnambool community is indeed fortunate that work of such a particularly high standard is available through the honorary system.

During the year Dr. Ian Holt resigned as In-patients' Physician and Dr. Dorrie Holt as Pathologist, as they had purchased a practice in Sydney. Dr. W. Beetham was appointed In-patients' Physician.

Facilities at this Hospital were used to conduct a very successful clinical meeting of the South Western Branch of the British Medical Association during April.

## NURSES' GRADUATION CEREMONY

The Graduation Ceremony, held in December, was most successful. Our guest speaker, Dr. J. G. Hurley, Commissioner of the Hospitals and Charities Commission, gave a most interesting and informative address.

## LEGACIES

A very valuable legacy was received just after the closing of the financial year and the Board records appreciation for the legacy of the whole of the estate of the late Mr James Gale for building or equipping a Children's Ward. The estate, mainly comprising a home in Keer Street, realised the sum of £2047/9/0. This will be invested in Inscribed Stock until used for the purpose specified.

## EGG APPEAL

This year's appeal resulted in a total of 2079 dozen being donated, with a value at that date of £350.

We are very indebted to our organiser, Mr L. Henderson, and to his helpers for their excellent work, to the Warrnambool Standard, whose publicity made the success possible. The district schools again contributed the bulk of the total, and to the teachers, students and parents who co-operated, we express our thanks.

## JOHN HUNTER HENDERSON MEMORIAL

From the gift of £1000 contributed by the family of the late Dr. J. H. Henderson, very valuable training equipment has been purchased and its benefit over the future years could hardly be assessed. The Talkie Film Projector and Strip Film Projector are used regularly for Nurses' training and Doctors' Clinical Lectures, and as well as a means of entertainment to patients and staff. The larger proportion of the Nurses and Doctors' Library has been purchased, as well as Wall Charts and Models for Nurses' Training. Through his generous gift we can feel confident of having one of the best equipped training schools of the State.

**APPEAL**

Our Annual Appeal again met with very generous response by the public. The figures shown in our records represent the Appeal of March 1951, when a total of £6380 was paid over by the Manager of 3YB in May 1951. The Appeal of April 1952 realised £10,081. These wonderful results were made possible by the Argus Broadcasting Services placing the services of the Station 3YB at our disposal. Valuable as this was, the appeal received its inspiration from the personal efforts and organising ability of Mr Lloyd and his Staff, and no words of ours could adequately express our appreciation for the wholehearted support of 3YB Staff, and through them to our public, whose response was so spontaneous.

**LIFE GOVERNORS**

At the last Annual Meeting, Messrs Chas. Sedgley, A. E. Scott, L. J. Henderson, L. C. Smith and Mrs M. A. Hatfield were appointed Life Governors in recognition of many years of signal service to the Hospital.

**CONCLUSION**

The area which the Hospital serves is ever expanding and statistical figures in this report show the increasing demand being placed on the Hospital services. With the acquisition of "Alveston" Old Folks Home, the Board is now providing accommodation daily for 175 patients.

Your Committee appeals to all Warrnambool and district citizens for full support. Hospital financial problems are grave and successful local appeals are essential to our well being.

It is impossible to thank all who help us, but mention must be made to the Manager and Staff of 3YB and the Warrnambool Standard for excellent support, and to all others who assisted we tender sincere thanks.

I wish to personally thank members of the Board for loyal support and co-operation throughout the year.
