## 102nd ANNUAL REPORT

To the Life Governors and Contributors  
Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Committee of Management has pleasure

in submitting its 102nd Annual Report and  
Financial Statements for the 12 months ended  
30th June, 1956.

### BUILDING PLANS AND RENOVATIONS

The most prominent project in hand is the erection of the Services Block near Ryot Street entrance. The Building contractors commenced at the end of June, 1956, and the area has been excavated to accommodate the basement and single story structure. A section of foundations is being built of sufficient strength for the ultimate multi story structure over this portion. Unfortunately the Board Room and a small upstairs section must be demolished.

The incorporation of modern Departments for X-Ray, Pharmacy, Out-patients, Pathology, Physiotherapy, and Blood Bank will prove of great advantage for diagnostic and therapy treatment at the Hospital. One of the special Clinics will be dedicated as a memorial to the

late Major Tom. Redford.

Contracts have been let to the following :—

Building — E. S. Harris & Co.

Mechanical — W'bool Engineering Works

Electrical — W'bool Engineering Works

Total Contract price total £173,034.

This amount plus Architects Fees and fixed equipment will be met from Government Funds, and Warrnambool and District Contribution will be £35,000.

Marcus Saltau House Toilet Facilities will be improved when a Toilet Block at present under construction is completed in September. The contract has been let to Fotheringham Bros. at a cost of £2,688.

### LAUNDRY

Plans are advanced for the erection of a new Laundry and a permit to proceed will be sought later this year. The present laundry is obsolete and inadequate for the large volume of work. In addition to the increasing Base

Hospital linen demand, other Hospitals in Corangamite Region look to our Laundry for service. An agreement has also been reached to handle the needs of the Mental Home to be opened in Warrnambool shortly.

### CORANGAMITE REGION

As the Base Hospital of this region, responsibilities have increased. The main objects being general co-operation and granting assistance to surrounding Hospitals. Typical assistance is that of urgent transfer of Insulcots for treatment of premature babies. Three such cots are available here for that purpose, each valued at

£340 fully paid by the Hospital and Charities Commission.

Weekly Physiotherapy Service to Camperdown, Terang, Port Fairy, and Koroit has been maintained, and the fortnightly service to Mortlake and Timboon only temporarily suspended owing to Staff change.

### BLOOD BANK

A modern Department has been established during the year under the title of Warrnambool Hospital Red Cross Blood Bank.

A total of 423 transfusions was given and in addition, 44 pints of serum were used representing a further 132 pints of blood.

Day and Evening Bleeding sessions have been

arranged, and generous voluntary assistance has been given by Mrs. T. B. Patrick and members of the Intermediate Red Cross.

The unit will provide the opportunity of transferring a smooth working unit into the special Blood Bank section of the building under construction on Ryot Street frontage.

### BOILERS

An extension of the Boiler House allowed the installation of Two 50 h.p. Oil Burning Generators which are giving excellent service. Storage capacity is of 6,600 gallons of oil fuel.

An Emergency Electric power plant has been installed in case of temporary S.E.C. power failure.

## PROBLEM OF THE AGED

The ever increasing demand for accommodation throws a burden on Alveston and Corio Old Folks Homes both of which are providing a service beyond value for this community and worthy of our highest praise. In each Home the 30 beds are constantly full with a large waiting list.

Matron E. Smith and Matron I. M. Moore of Alveston and Corio respectively, give exemplary service combining with their duties a sincere and sympathetic approach to their aged patients.

A large solarium has been built at Alveston giving a magnificent view of "wider horizons."

## PATIENTS

The daily average of patients treated was less during the year being 140.8 patients per day as compared with 149.4 last year. However the total treated was 4337 slightly above last year. One of the two main reasons was the satisfying reduction of patients treated in the T.B. Chalet as compared with last year; numbers were also

## FINANCE

Overall cost of Maintenance was £204,112 and Income £193,336 showing a deficit of £10,746.

Although number of staff was only slightly increased, wages rose to £120,773, the main factor being cost of living rises. Daily bed cost is 74/10.

About £1000 was lost on Visiting Nurse and Visiting Physiotherapist Services and Blood Bank expenditure is not recoverable.

Regional responsibilities have increased over all costs also.

Concern is felt by the Board at the steady drift of finances, with no apparent plan within the power of the Charities Commission to arrest the drift, and Bank Overdrafts have been increasing at an alarming rate.

Alveston with a Daily bed cost of 29/2 per patient per day had a deficit of £780, and Corio with a bed cost of 34/6 per patient had a deficit of £3921. Wages represents 80% of costs in these homes.

Fees in these Old Folks Homes are still being maintained at £7/7/0 per week which is considerably below the maintenance costs of patients.

The Board of Management places on record its appreciation for the whole hearted co-operation rendered to the institution by its senior nursing and administrative officers.
