## Obituary

It is with great regret that we record the deaths of —

Dr. Horace Iles Holmes, M.D., F.R.A.C.S. — 24/11/59.

Dr. Cecil Bryden Berryman, M.B., F.R.A.C.S., MR.A.C.P., F.R.S.M.—17/2/60

Dr. H. I. Holmes was prominently associated with the professional and community life in Warrnambool for over 50 years, having commenced practice in Warrnambool in 1905 and was Honorary Surgeon and later Honorary Consultant Surgeon for this full period.

Dr. Holmes was a doctor of medicine for 56 years and an early member of the Royal Australian College of Surgeons and Medical Officer of Health to Warrnambool city for 38 years.

He had been a member of the Committee of Management and was a Life Governor of the Hospital and his continuing interest was recognised in 1959 when the newly constructed Pathology Laboratory was named "Horace Iles Holmes Pathological Laboratory." He also showed keen interest in Lyndoch Hostel for the Aged and was President of the Committee for four years.

Dr. Holmes exerted a powerful influence in this city and at all times set a high standard of community service. His guidance was recognised in the growth of the Hospital from its early days as a Benevolent Asylum, then a District Hospital, and in 1928 its broader aspect of Warrnambool Base Hospital.

Dr. C. B. Berryman, who passed away in his 59th year, was a competent prominent surgeon.

A graduate of Melbourne University, he first practised at Devonport, Tasmania, and travelled extensively overseas. He set a high personal standard in attaining Senior qualifications and this city has been richer for his association for 20 years.

Shortly before the outbreak of World War 2, Dr. Berryman bought the practice of Dr. Holmes. Dr. Holmes then served as locum tenens whilst Dr. Berryman served in the Army in the Western Desert Campaign until he was discharged in 1944 with the rank of Major. Dr. Berryman was Senior Honorary Surgeon to Warrnambool Hospital and in 1957 was appointed Consultant Honorary Surgeon.

As Medical Officer of Health for the city for 14 years, he showed particular interest in protection of the population against epidemic diseases, especially salk vaccine against Poliomyelitis.

Dr. Berryman had wide community interests in sport and service organisations.

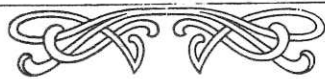

# Warrnambool & District Base Hospital Incorporated

## 106th ANNUAL REPORT

To the Life Governors and Contributors —

Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is with great pleasure that I submit the 106th Annual Report of the Committee of Management covering the activities of the Hospital for the year ended 30th June, 1960. This is presented against a background of over a century of development and service to this district.

I am proud of what has been achieved in past years and confident that vital services will continue to keep on expanding.

### CAPITAL WORKS

Year by year the appearance of the Hospital is changing and the policy adopted by the Committee many years ago of orderly progression towards a planned and modern Base Hospital service has been taking shape in more practical form through the past year. The planning for a multi-storey structure to accommodate Public patients is nearing completion. It has gone to a sketch plan stage and approval is awaited for working drawings and specifications. It is planned that four floors above the present Outpatients' Department will include Children's, Male and Female Medical and Surgical with Operating Theatre and Central Dressings on top floor.

Plans are also at sketch plan stage for improved Kitchen Refrigeration facilities and early approval is expected.

A feature of the year has been the general improvement in established sections of the Hospital, notably Kitchen area with remodelled Domestic Dining Room, Diet Kitchen, Dry Goods Stores, Caterer's Office and extension to Nurses Dining Room Pantry. All have been rebuilt by Hospital Maintenance Staff.

Attractive flats have been prepared in the grounds for use by Senior Tutor and Medical Technologist.

Enclosing verandah area has given enlarged administrative office accommodation. Female public ward has been partitioned for privacy and lighting in both Female and Male wards renewed. Children's Ward has been improved with the addition of a new Sterilising Room with modern steam pressure equipment. Similar steam pressure equipment has been installed in Operating Theatre and Midwifery Floor.

Air-conditioning at a cost of £1,293 has also been installed in Major Operating Theatre to control and regulate variance of summer and winter temperatures.

### LAUNDRY

In October, 1959, the long-awaited new Laundry went into production as a Group Laundry catering for the needs of the Corangamite Region. Total cost, including equipment, was £60,000 of which the Government contributed a major portion.

The Calor Multi-Roll ironer installed was the first such unit in Victoria, the second in Australia, and has considerably stepped up the output in this section.

The Central Linen Exchange system wherein all linen stocks have been purchased by the Laundry and are issued daily on a basis of a charge per lb. dry weight is functioning smoothly. Participating Hospitals at present are Warrnambool Base, Alveston, Corio, Koroit, Lyndoch, Mortlake and Terang and there will be additions later. The linen of Brierly Mental Home is also treated.

Monthly output is now 62,000 lbs. and is rising. Delivery is made to all participating Hospitals thrice weekly by hospital-owned vehicle, especially built to be dust and weather proof.

Some adjustment in original construction of Laundry has proved necessary owing to the enlarged demand. Storage shelving and seamstress departments have been enlarged and an extension to provide cover for vehicle and additional soiled and clean linen sorting is becoming necessary.

#### LADIES' AUXILIARY EFFORTS

Auxiliary activity has been most heartening and of inestimable value to hospital finance. Your Committee records the thanks of all hospital-minded citizens to these ladies who have formed rallying points in our city and district.

This short precis can give little indication of the efforts of each but is a mark of appreciation.

A branch small in numbers but the year of activity shows its ability to rally fine support for its functions. The income of £236 was raised by Street Stall, Baby Show, Card Afternoon, visit of 3YB Concert Party and donations. ## STATISTICS AND FINANCE

Balance sheets appear elsewhere in this issue so we merely draw attention to their messages of recording a year of service in terms of patients treated and essential expenses caused thereby.

This Committee greatly regrets the action felt necessary by the Victorian Government to stabilise finance by raising fees. This instruction was carried out reluctantly by your Committee and as it was only introduced close to the end of the financial year, time only can tell how effective will be the result. Such rises highlight the essential need for all families to seek financial protection available through Benefit Funds at a comparatively small outlay.

The earlier margins rise on most wages in Victoria has had adverse effect on our expenditure during the latter part of the year.

## SPECIALIST DEPARTMENTS

All of those Technical Departments dealing with the scientific art of medicine, especially Pathology under Dr. J. Reid and X-ray under Dr. A. T. Park, have shown a marked growth in service to the city and Corangamite Regional service.

Warrnambool Hospital Red Cross Blood Bank service has reached a high standard and it is gratifying to record generous response by the public in maintaining donors' lists. Through the assistance of Junior Chamber of Commerce, when donors were enrolled in a caravan in the city centre, plus staff visits to Port Fairy and Nestles, our lists received 240 new donors, bringing the total to 1099 donors.

Pharmacy, Physiotherapy and Outpatients' Departments each contribute valuable therapeutic aid to this area. Ante Natal Clinics were conducted weekly by the Hospital.

## VOLUNTARY SERVICES

In addition to voluntary service during Appeal period, many hospital-minded citizens in diverse ways gave freely of time and effort throughout the year. Honorary Medical and Dental Staff maintained a high standard of unselfish and competent service in the public wards. Dr. R. Beetham is on 12 months' leave to do an advanced course, his place being taken by Dr. J. Bell.

Honorary Optometrists gave freely of time and goods to aid the sight of elderly patients in the Base, Alveston and Corio.

Peter MacCallum Clinic and Poliomyelitis Council continued regular visits to impart valuable specialist advice of great benefit to those of this district.

School children support under the guidance of teachers has been a heartening feature of the year, especially at times of egg appeal and 3YB Radio Appeal.

The Warrnambool Standard has been co-operative in news coverage and created good public relations with those we serve in the district.

Red Cross Library has been completely renewed and two weekly distributions of books are made to our patients. Thanks are due to Mr. Ian Clark and other voluntary helpers in this much-appreciated service.

The Red Cross Diversional Therapy Group visit weekly and teach the art of craft work to lessen the tedium for long stay patients. Nestanglo Social Club and Warrnambool Fire Brigade and other organisations maintain the spirit of Christmas and good will in our wards.

Rotary Club continue their visits on the birthday of each aged patient and these kindly visits and gifts recognise birthdays of many who have no relatives to mark the occasion.

Gideons International representatives visited in March 1960 and presented 230 New Testaments for the use of patients at the Base, Alveston and Corio. In addition, nursing staff each received attractively bound volumes.

## OUR PIONEERS

The increasing span of life gives in its turn a challenging problem of accommodation. Alveston and Corio Homes have each increased bed capacity and patients under the care of Matrons E. Smith and M. Hammond respectively, receive kindly and competent care in the evening of their lives. At the Hospital, Ward 4 (Sister T. Hall) and Ward 5 (Sister M. Banner) also spare no effort to give contentment and happiness to their aged patients.

Outstanding in support of these Homes is the F.J. Trousers Staff, who by voluntary weekly personal contributions, without raffles or competitions, provide finance for comforts and enlargement of this service and as well give friendship, kindly interest and personal gifts in weekly visits to each Home. Through these efforts, supplemented equally by the Firm, a total of £1,556/8/11 was contributed to purchase heaters, cushions, chairs, breakfast trays, rugs, etc. and leaving a large capital sum in trust for building expansion plans. These plans are almost reality at Corio where it is planned to commence construction of accommodation for eight extra beds late in 1960. Alveston also will have structural improvements not yet in final plan stage.

We are indebted to the Home Exhibition Organisers for £50 each, Corio and Alveston, also to many Church Clubs and Organisations who provided musical afternoons and treats.

Partly-trained Nursing Aides form the major basis of our Staff and if compulsory training to the stage of registration is enforced, staffing may prove a difficult problem.

## NURSING.

Matron D. A. Swinton, ably assisted by Miss A. Haddow, Deputy Matron, has maintained nursing services at a high standard. The year has proved difficult through shortage of senior administrative staff and changes of control in several departments.

In October 1959, Mr. G. Coulson, F.C.N.A., was appointed our Senior Tutor and he has brought specialised knowledge and enthusiasm to this important teaching post. Applications for training are at full strength to our requirements. Application for registration as a Nursing Aide Training School has been made to the Hospitals Commission and a decision is awaited.

Mr. Lindsay's ability to keep abreast of the latest trends in modern hospital development is proving of immense value as we plan for our new multi-storey ward block.

In all respects, Mr. Lindsay has carried out his duties with keenness and tact, earning him the respect of every member of the staff, while his very able administration has won the wholehearted support and appreciation of the entire Board of Management.

## STAFF

Dr. R. H. J. Laurence and Dr. F. R. Braithwaite have contributed a year of competent service as Senior and Junior Resident Medical Officers respectively.

Mr. W. I. Layther, Assistant Manager and Mr. A. Matthews, Accountant, commenced in July, 1959, and have proved constructive in thought and efficient officers in administrative matters. We record with great regret the death of Miss R. Murphy in October, 1959. She had been a senior office member for 19 years.

## CATERING

This valuable aid to Medical Therapy is recognised and has received special attention. In September, Mr. H. Burchell was appointed caterer, and has brought to this department long experience in food services in other spheres, and has revolutionised the preparation and presentation of patient and staff meals.

## APPEAL

The Staff of 3YB Station, headed by Manager Mr. E. Collings and Studio Manager Mr. N. Bradley, gave liberally of time and effort to ensure a successful appeal. The result exceeded all expectations and created a record since the inception of this appeal. Warrnambool's return totalled £9814, being £8000 Base, £1166 Alveston and £648 Corio.

I firmly believe that hospitals are a productive element of the country's economy and should be regarded as such. To reap dividends, investments must first be made whether the investment be energy or finance. Primary investments need of all hospitals nowadays is finance so that expansion and improved efficiency of service may be possible.

The opening remarks of this report draw attention to the vigorous policy of development and your Committee is alert to the need for a sustained and orderly improvement. Extra nursing staff accommodation and additional boiler facilities are two of probable early ventures.

Thus obsolescence will gradually give way to a modern approach to hospitalisation and the planned efficiency expected be available to all in our area.

In conclusion may I add my personal thanks to all hospital-minded friends and especially to my loyal colleagues on the voluntary Committee of Management for splendid support and co-operation during the year.

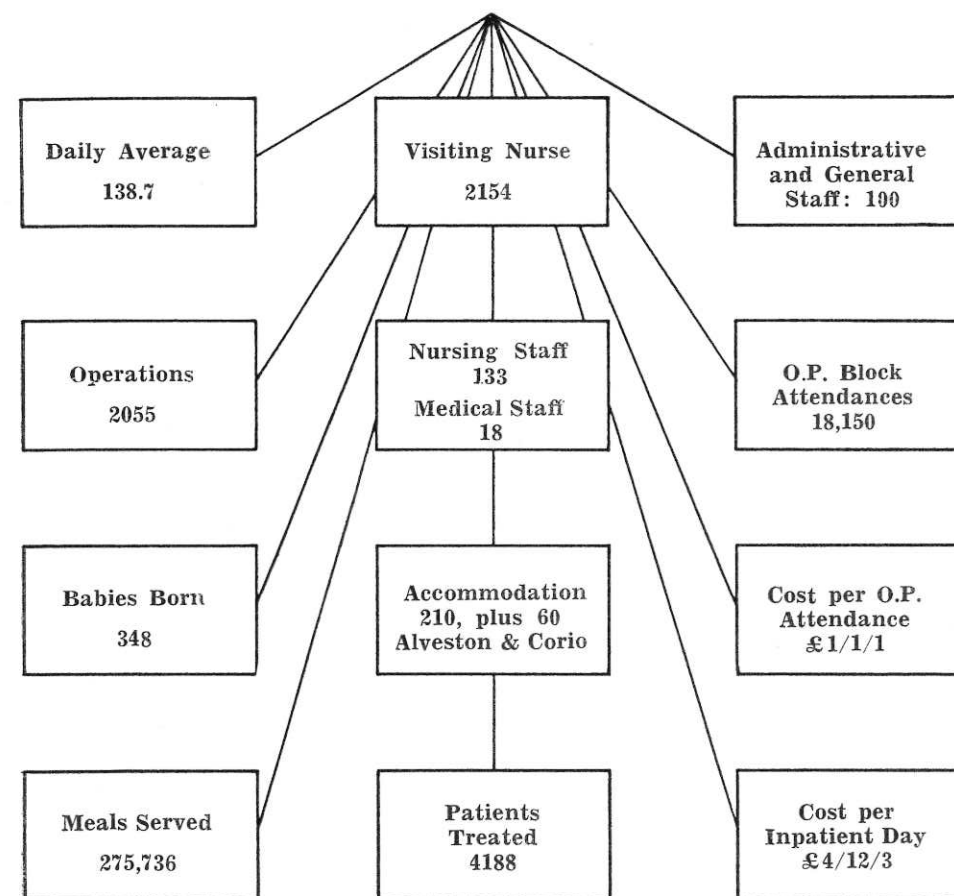

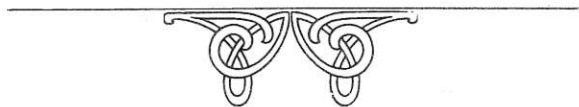
