110th Annual Report

TO THE LIFE GOVERNORS AND CONTRIBUTORS —

Ladies and Gentlemen,

It is with great pleasure that I submit the 110th Annual Report and audited Financial Statement for the year ended 30th June, 1964.

I take pride in what have been noteworthy achievements in this past year and feel confident that development providing vital services to this district will continue to expand.

It would need a broad canvass to paint the total story of one year's progress in an organisation so complex and inter-related as a hospital as reports must be necessarily abridged.

BUILDING CONSTRUCTION:

Year by year the appearance of the hospital is changing and the policy adopted by the Committee many years ago of orderly progress towards a suitably planned modern Base Hospital is taking practical form.


The highlight of the year was the opening of the Multi-Storey Public Ward Block of 70 beds, described in detail in our 1963 Report, on November 17th, 1964. We were honoured by the presence of the Honourable R. W. Mack, M.L.C., Minister of Health, who performed the Opening Ceremony, also Dr. J. H. Lindell, Chairman of the Hospitals Commission. The very large attendance of representatives of all districts of the Corangamite Region on that occasion was indicative of the public interest. The success of the £50,000 Development Appeal had increased public knowledge and those who attended inspected with interest the name plaques above doors, indicating gifts by generous donors.

The building was built by men who took pride in their craftsmanship and worked efficiently, and it is up to this hospital and staff to create an atmosphere to make it appreciated as a true centre of healing.

Beds have been at capacity demand since that date and the availability of this modern accommodation has marked a quickening tempo in our hospital activities. The total of our bed capacity has not greatly increased as we closed some sections, so total rose from 210 to 234 but quality of accommodation markedly improved.

WORKS IN PROGRESS:

Two major building projects are also moving towards reality—Operating Theatre, Casualty and Central Dressings Department is one contract, and the second Boiler House. The former is in course of construction adjacent to the Multi-Storey Block to which it will be joined. Of the six tenders received that of E. S. Harris of Warrnambool, totalling £143,347 was approved, and on present planning construction should be completed Autumn, 1965. A separate tender will be let at a later date to complete the Casualty Department which will be constructed in shell form in first contract. Theatre and Central Dressings Department will be fully completed.

My Committee shares the nostalgic regret at the demolition of our oldest historical section, which since 1853 has formed a core of the hospital.

Considerable alterations and rehabilitation of buildings was necessary to provide alternative accommodation, also the purchase of a house for staff accommodation.

Our Boiler House program has been necessary to exchange our inefficient hand-fired Steam Raising Plant for automatic briquette units and should raise our Boiler efficiency from 60 per cent efficiency to at least 85 per cent efficiency per

boiler. This project is also staged and the section being completed is a brick structure on the Hider Street frontage which is housing two new Automatic Down Jet type briquette burning generators. Total cost of £23,000 being provided by the Hospitals Commission.

Planning is in hand to commence stage two, which is an increase in the building area and installation of a further two generators. The final program calls for six generators.

FUTURE PROJECTS:

The only other section advanced to the drawing board stage is the Administrative Offices with which is associated Medical Records Department on the site of the present Theatres. The actual construction may be delayed for a period but it is desirable that it have a high priority because of the unsatisfactory temporary Administrative offices and also because this section will form the main entrance to the Hospital on the south side of the Multi Storey Building. It will enhance the whole appearance, facilitate enquiries and improve communications, which leave much to be desired at present.

Under discussion with the Hospitals Commission is the inadequacy of Nursing Staff accommodation, both living space and teaching facilities. Whilst we have greatly appreciated our general progress to date they are also aspects requiring urgent consideration.

Our private and intermediate section of Marcus Saltau House will receive attention and renovations in the early future.

Smaller undertakings of restorative and decorative nature have been carried out including wards 6 and 7 for geriatric care where staff services and sunroom facilities have been improved. Nurses' Home covered way has been recovered and enclosed, and Sisters' home floors, lighting and room renovations are in hand.

HOSPITALS & CHARITIES COMMISSION:

Appreciation is expressed to Dr. J. H. Lindell, Chairman, members of the Commission, Executive Officers and Staff for a further year of service and practical support. Our requests have been met with co-operation and understanding, and a generous policy as funds would allow, has been adopted towards our financial needs.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT:

The following members retire by effluxion of time or by By-law 31, but are eligible for re-election — Messrs. B. Auty, V. G. Balmer, A. W. R. Lewis, J. McD. Taylor, Dr. R. R. Sobey.

At our May meeting the resignation of Mr. R. V. Philpott through ill health was received with much regret. Mr. Philpott served this hospital loyally and ably as a Board Member for 30 years with a term as President, and also gave of his wide experience as President of the Country Hospitals' Association of Victoria for a period of two years.

The Board also lost the valuable services and sound guidance of a staunch supporter through the resignation of Dr. Irving Buzzard, who joined the Board in 1940 and served ever since as a Board Member, with a term as President. Dr. Buzzard has left Warrnambool to take up residence in Melbourne, and we extend to him best wishes for many enjoyable years of retirement.

Dr. R. R. Sobey and Mr. V. G. Balmer, Dentist, will now join the Board in the vacancies thus created.

FINANCE AND STATISTICS:

Perusal of later reports indicates in detail the financial and statistical record. The Committee is constantly faced with the need for careful financial management. This year has been difficult as financial consideration must be allied with the necessity to maintain and improve scope of patient services in keeping with the pace of latest development and advances in medical science. This presents a constant challenge.

We open our new year in an atmosphere where still further increased costs with wage margins and increased leave are working through all our cost structures without any compensation increase in our revenue earning powers.


The hospital field even although selling a product of good health cannot be any exception, but how these increased costs are to be met has not yet been determined. It can only be through increased fees or increased Government Grants.

During the year the vast amount of work by the Hospitals Commission and Administrators bore fruit with the introduction of the new Accounting System commencing 1/7/64 in hospitals of all grades. We were more fortunate in that for a considerable period our processes have been on a similar basis of accounting, namely responsibility accounting, so our change-over is not so revolutionary. This introduction will give scope to the Hospitals Commission for a clearer comparison and better budget control within hospitals.

Amongst statistics you will note the rise in Daily Average from 138.5 patients per day to 145.1.

VOLUNTARY SERVICES:

Honorary Medical and Dental Staffs gave skilled attention and generous service at personal sacrifice and without monetary reward.

Honorary Optometrists gave unsparing service to providing spectacles for aged and indigent patients at the Base, Alveston and Corio.

The Mental Hygiene Authority continued to conduct Psychiatric Clinics in the Outpatients' Department.

Red Cross Library and Red Cross Diversional Therapy Group are both now located in new quarters and are increasing the scope of their activities to lessen the tedium for long stay patients.

Peter McCallum Clinic, Poliomyelitis Council, conduct regular visits to impart specialist advice of great benefit.

Ministers of Religion of all denominations have been attentive in giving spiritual comfort to our patients.

Rotary, Apex and Lions Club have conducted praiseworthy services and Nestle's Social Club, Fire Brigade and others have maintained the spirit of Christmas goodwill.

SPECIALIST DEPARTMENTS:

Corangamite Region is fortunate to be served by such modern technical services and public confidence is evident in the terms of increasing volume of examinations.

Dr. J. D. Reid, Pathologist and Dr. A. T. Park, Radiologist, control departments which are constantly expanding. This growing pressure in diagnostic department is indicated by the fact that in five years Pathology examinations have lifted from 6400 to 18,900 and X-rays from 3660 to 5150.

Congratulations are extended to Dr. J. D. Reid upon being elected a Foundation Member of the College of Pathology, Great Britain.

Resident Medical Officers Dr. C. H. Lim and Dr. N. M. Woo are setting a high standard in public wards, theatre and Outpatients.


Physiotherapy, Pharmacy and Blood Bank maintain a high standard in public services. Mr. Luney, Blood Bank Officer, has been granted the award of Membership of the International Society of Blood Transfusions, Geneva.

Consultative Clinics by visiting specialists continued to maintain excellent service.

NURSING:

Nursing Administrators in all Hospitals are facing the problems of acute shortages of nurses compared with demands. The major cause is the continuous and significant increase needed for treatment under present-day conditions. The ratio in 1930 was one nurse to treat 2.23 patients, in 1950 one nurse to 1.32 patients and 1963 one nurse to .86 patients. Close human relationship and sympathy is more than ever necessary in these swiftly-moving days to avoid any semblance of mechanical, unfeeling, or assembly line approach to patient care.

Early in the year Miss D. A. Swinton, M.B.E., submitted her resignation after 16½ years as Matron of this Hospital. Opportunity was taken at several farewells early in May, to express the respect and affection in which she was held. Miss Swinton left in mid May for an overseas trip.

Miss D. Barclay, who had been Deputy Matron for nine months, was appointed Matron, and she can count upon the loyalty and full support of the Committee in carrying out this exacting responsible position.

Sister A. Rush, Tutor Sister of Prince Henry's Hospital, was appointed Deputy Matron and Sister M. D. Smith, Deputy Matron of Swan Hill, was appointed Assistant Matron. The additional appointment was considered desirable due to recent expansion of occupied beds bringing with it the need for revision of hours of total coverage by Senior Nursing Administrators.

Miss S. Brandenberger, who had been Sister in Charge of Midwifery Floor for six years, accepted the position as Matron of Healesville Hospital and was replaced by Sister A. E. Foster.

Charge Sisters play a significant part in the nursing services. This responsible position covers supervision of patients' treatment, Nurse Training, Records and Supplies. To those in charge we express appreciation.

Applications for General Training and Nurse Aide Training are the highest for many years, and examination results over the past 12 months reflect great credit upon the Tutors and students.





CARE OF THE AGED:

Satisfactory care of the aged is an economic and humanitarian world-wide problem as 10% of population is of pensionable age. We are well aware the best place for old people is in their homes, but for a variety of reasons it is impossible for many to achieve this state. The facilities we offer for care and comfort in Corio, Alveston and Wards 4, 5, 6 and 7 total 164 beds which are always in full demand with a waiting list. The staffs give unstintingly of time and effort to give happiness and contentment to their patients.

Heartening support comes from Church Organisations, Fletcher Jones and Staff, Rotary and Apex Clubs and many individual well wishers.

Matron Ruth French resigned from Alveston during the year to accept an administrative position in Gippsland and Mrs. T. Surridge was appointed Matron and Sister I. Bruce as Deputy; each has contributed outstanding service in the intervening period.

To Matron F. Hammond of Corio we express appreciation for wholehearted interest in maintaining a high standard of care to those in her charge.

APPEAL:

The Management and Staff of 3YB gave liberally of air time and personal effort to ensure a successful Appeal. From this enthusiasm and hard work came a district total of £24,381, of which the Base received £9619, Alveston £1,159 and Corio £521. We record deep appreciation to our Darby and Joan candidates who rallied loyal support and raised large totals.

CENTRAL LINEN SERVICE:

This service has been expanded since our last report by the inclusion of Camperdown, Lismore and Port Fairy Hospitals, making a total of 814 Hospital Beds receiving this service. Extra equipment has been purchased to cope with this increase plus the increase from the Multi Storey Building totalling £9,800. An extension of the building is also under consideration.

Mr. Ron Earl has been appointed Supervisor in place of Mr. B. Sherriff who ceased duty in February to return to Melbourne. Mr. Earl was a Supervisor at Royal Melbourne Hospital Linen Service.

BURSARIES:

The Committee has granted bursaries to students in the course of Speech Therapy and Medical Records Librarian. Both students should conclude courses end 1965 to commence duty at Warrnambool shortly afterwards.

KIOSK:

Worthy of favourable comment is the Kiosk situated on the ground floor adjacent to the lifts. Under the competent care of Mr. H. Burchell, Caterer, its colourful, orderly arrangement attracts many customers in addition to providing a splendid service of ward deliveries to patients.

ESTATES:

Two large estates were received — Late Mrs. A. W. Graham of Warrnambool, £1410, and the estate of Mary Dudson for Building Development, £2329.

MANAGER SECRETARY:

With so many changes during the past 12 months many difficulties have been encountered. That these have been kept to a minimum and that administration has continued to run so smoothly is due to the Manager Secretary keeping in close contact with all these problems. The Board of Management records its grateful appreciation and approval of the administration carried out by Mr. S. A. Lindsay.

STAFF:

Staff at the Base, Alveston and Corio now totals 383, which provides a 24-hour service seven days weekly.

The change in office site and increasing service to our public has greatly increased administrative duties.

Mr. W. I. Layther, Assistant Manager, has accepted the additional posts of Safety Control Officer and Secretary to the Infections Committee.

Mr. A. Matthews, Accountant, has increasing duties due to the introduction of the new accounting system.


Both are constructive and efficient officers who give unstintingly of time and energy in the furtherance of the interests of the hospital.


