111th Annual Report

TO THE LIFE GOVERNORS AND CONTRIBUTORS —

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I have the honour to present the 111th Annual Report and Audited Financial Statement for the year ended 30th June, 1965 for the Base Hospital and Alveston and Corio Homes.

We feel that many friends in our community have watched this progress with great interest. The activity in our building program is the culmination of years of planning. As in 1964, when we reported upon the erection of the Multi Storey Ward Block, we have added, this year, another major construction which adds greatly to our modernisation program and gives improved service to the community we serve.

BUILDING DEVELOPMENT:

We take pride in recording that the Operating Theatres and Central Sterilizing Supply Department have become reality and this unit was officially opened by Dr. J. H. Lindell, Chairman of the Hospitals and Charities Commission on June 20th. Contract price was £143,347 plus equipment.

Casualty Department on the ground floor was partly constructed in shell form and will be the subject of a later contract.

In early stages of building the complexity of planning was very evident and ceilings now cover much which indicated the meticulous attention and detail necessary in such departments.

The Theatre Suites are on the same floor level as Multi Storey Block Surgical Ward and features wide spacious corridors leading into two Major and one Minor Theatre with attendant anaesthetic rooms, working areas and Doctors and Nurses Change Rooms. A feature is the three bed recovery room to stage the transfers of very seriously ill surgical cases prior to readmission to wards. Whole area is air conditioned.

Central Sterilizing Supply Department processes, issues and controls professional sterile supplies such as Tray Sets, Syringes, apparatus etc. to all Departments for the care and safety of our patients. This Department is sub-divided into four sub areas for receiving, cleaning, sterilizing and storage of sterile goods.

Plaques in these Departments record generous donors whose gifts are thus recognised.

Laundry — An extension of Sorting Area was completed at a cost of £6,735 paid from Laundry Reserve Funds.

Ward Extensions — Medical and Surgical Wards in Multi Storey Building both gained an additional four beds by sub-division of Sun Rooms.

Nursing Administrators Flats — Three flats are almost completed for Matron, Deputy and Assistant Matron on the Koroit Street frontage.

Tutoring — One of the primary responsibilities of the Hospital is to provide a sound well balanced training for girls who seek to serve the community as members of the Nursing Profession. A new department is being built by conversion of part of the Mezzanine Floor to provide well equiped lecture rooms, demonstration areas, library and offices. Cost £7,800.

Boiler House — Stages 1 and 2 are nearing completion including new building construction and four Automatic Down Jet Briquette Burning Generators for steam raising. At a later stage two more generators will be added thus allowing dismantling of the the old worn out equipment on nearby site.

Housing — A house at Corio Home has been constructed as a staff residence.

Renovations — General maintenance of the older section and roofs in particular have received attention.

The year has been a creative one and the involved disruption of the accustomed pathways and communications is an unavoidable part of progressive activity.

WHAT OF THE FUTURE:

Permission has been granted for preparation of Working Drawings and Specifications for Administrative Offices and Medical Records Department on the old Theatre site, also Nurses Home extension on Koroit Street frontage to accommodate twenty-seven Nursing Sisters. It is hoped to commence construction of both buildings at an early date.

HOSPITALS AND CHARITIES COMMISSION:

We feel that Dr. J. H. Lindell, Chairman, Commissioners and Administrative staff have given every possible consideration to proposals we have submitted and the Hospital has received generous and fair treatment in monetary allocations in view of the many demands made on the Commission resources. We appreciate the courtesy and help we always receive from representatives of the Commission.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT:

The following members retire by effluxion of time but being eligible, present themselves for re-election — Messrs. A. Anderson, R. G. Bennett, F. P. Callaghan, W. J. Huffer, P. T. Parker, A. J. Smart.

Dr. A. E. Brauer was granted six months leave of absence for a visit overseas.

HONORARY SERVICES:

The Committee gratefully acknowledges the work of the Honorary Medical and Dental staffs and the skill and attention so freely and unselfishly bestowed. The community benefits greatly from this vital service and our progress and status is indicated by the increasing number of new specialities.

The service of special consultative clinics was greatly appreciated, notably Peter McCallum Clinic, Poliomyelitis Council and Psychiatric Clinic by Mental Hygiene Authority.

Dr. J. W. Bishop resigned as Honorary Visiting Ophthalmological Surgeon and Dr. R. M. Powrie was appointed Honorary Ophthalmological Surgeon.

Spiritual welfare of patients has been in the comforting hands of the various denominations and regular visits are greatly appreciated.

SPECIALIST DEPARTMENTS:

Technical Departments dealing with scientific art of medicine have shown a marked growth in service.

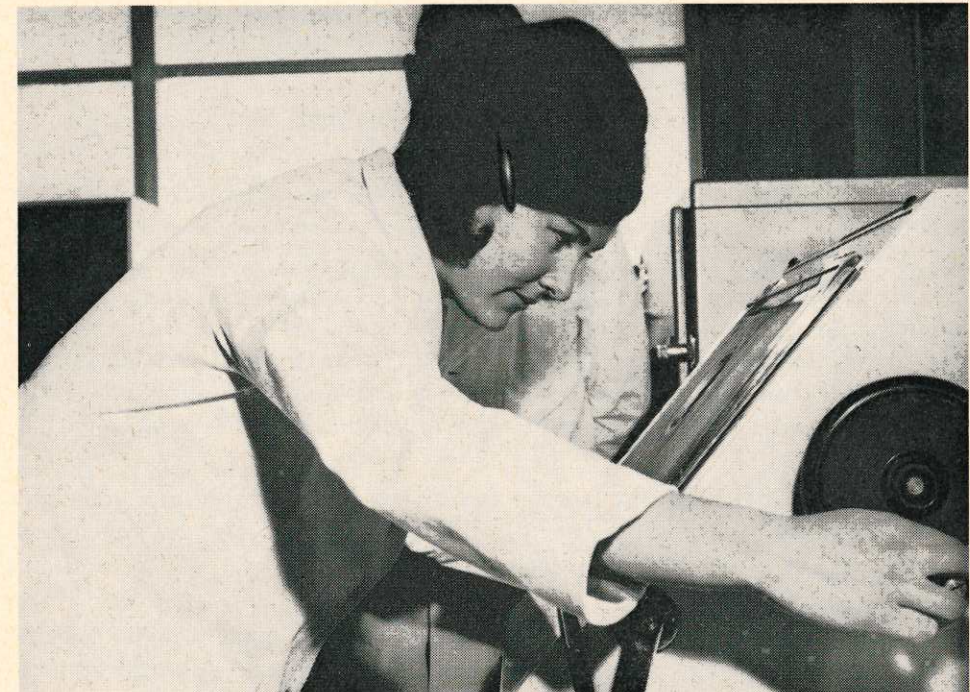
Pathology — Reports of examinations from this Department indicate the increasing demand for the laboratory side of medicine. The total of examinations gives little indication of meticulous care and attention to detail necessary in this vital work of guiding Medical clinicians towards actual diagnosis.

Blood Bank weekly withdrawal sessions is still receiving generous support by voluntary district donors but more voluntary donors on the panel would be welcomed.

In this department seven students are in course of training toward diploma status.

It is pleasing to congratulate Mr. G. O'Brien, Chief Technician, on being elected after examination success, as a Fellow of the Institute of Laboratory Technicians.

X-Ray — The scope of examinations in this department is constantly on the increase to benefit the region. Whilst the increase is general particularly noticeable increases were the follow up after T.B. Mass Survey of this area and military call-up check on chest normality.

Pharmacy — Volume of dispensing and preparation of sterilised injections for Theatre is on the increase and the Regional Hospitals receive drug supplies weekly in accordance with their requirements.

Imprest system of supplies to wards controls usage and gives efficient service.

Physiotherapy.—Treatments show an increase upon the needs of the aged and post operative care of fracture cases.

Visiting Psysiotherapy services to the region has an unbroken record of 12 years and gives valuable service to six Regional Hospitals.

Welfare Officer.—Medical Social Workers are in such demand in Melbourne that country Base Hospitals cannot attract trained Almoners. An appointment of Miss D. A. Swinton, an experienced Nursing Sister, who was Matron of this Hospital for 17 years, is filling a long felt need as Welfare Officer, and valuable service is being given as well as consolidation of this new field of service.

Speech Therapy and Medical Records.—It is pleasing to report that students at present in training under Bursaries from this Hospital will set up special departments in these fields early in 1966.

EQUIPMENT:

A large proportion of patient care comes from traffic accidents and the Hospital deplors the community cost, untold grief and suffering caused in this way. Special equipment has been received to treat severe chest injuries and the increasing volume of acute surgery and the following are in constant use —

STATISTICS AND FINANCE:

The primary object of the Hospital is to provide treatment for, and attention to, any person suffering from an ailment or injury. To fulfill this objective the Hospital treated 4171 Inpatients with a Daily Average of 149.75 and 26.708 Outpatients.

Finance is fully covered elsewhere by full reports which indicate the constant need of the Management to exercise careful financial management. Expansion of buildings and services imposes a personal and financial strain and the latter can only be fully assessed as occupation progresses. Close attention to budgeting is maintained but the new year opens with every indication of further increased costs for wages margins and increased leave, control of which is outside the power of the Board.

Compensating increase in revenue earning powers since the rise in Public fees to £4 daily for public treatment is difficult to foresee and only increased Government grants can meet this situation.

NURSING:

Miss D. Barclay, Matron, has a difficult task in maintaining a high standard because of frustration through staff storge in senior positions. Although trainee intake has improved the shortage in higher brackets seems an insuperable problem

in most Hospitals. Increased number of registered staff is essential to cope with the significant and continuous increase in Medical and Nursing demands under present day conditions.

Sister A. Rush, Deputy Matron, is on leave undergoing a course for the Diploma of Nursing Administration.

To senior administrative and Charge Sisters who each carry responsible positions closely associated with treatment of our patients we express appreciation.

The Board of Management wishes to record its grateful appreciation to Mr. Lindsay for his efficient administration and loyalty towards this hospital.

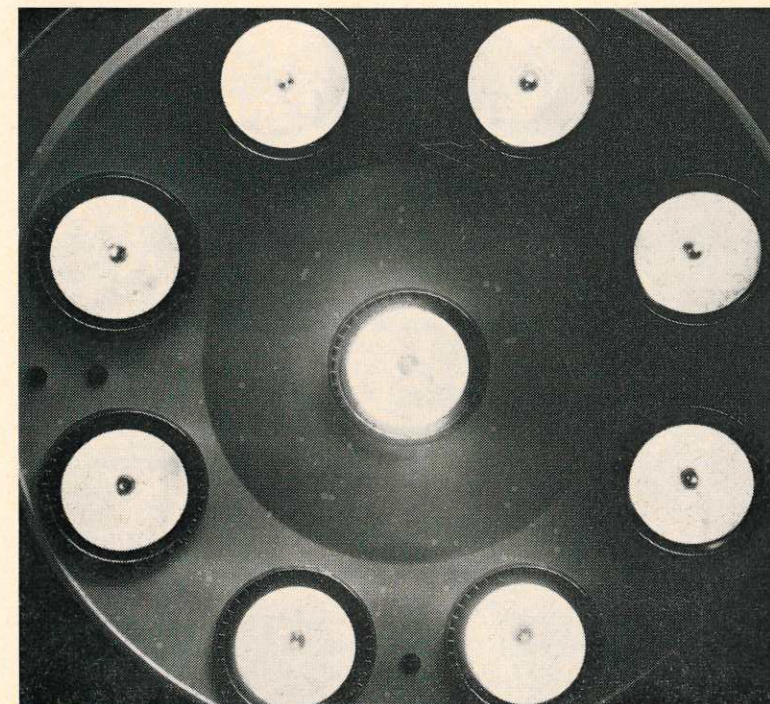
Medical Superintendent. — The appointment of Dr. J. D. Reid, Pathologist, to this important position gives great satisfaction to the Committee. Duties will be modified so that the excellent service provided by Dr. Reid in charge of Pathological services will not be impaired.

In the seven years since Dr. Reid joined our staff he has contributed greatly to the expansion in the wide medical field and has earned respect and goodwill from all with whom he is associated.

Mr. W. I. Layther Assistant Manager and Safety Control Officer, maintains a high standard of administrative service and combines with Mr. A. Matthews, Accountant, in further expansion of the complex accounting system still in its first year of introduction. This will shortly have a further complication by the changing to metric system. Both are unsparing of time and effort to further the interest of the Hospital.

It was pleasing to congratulate Mr. A. Mathews on completion of the exacting Diploma Course of Hospital Administrators and he is now admitted as a Licentiate in the Australian Institute of Hospital Administrators.

Mr. Barry Edgar transferred during the year to the position of Relieving Manager for the Hospitals and Charities Commission.

GENERAL SERVICES:

Total staff is 337 with 13 Administrative, 24 Medical Ancillary, 187 Nursing, 16 Engineering and Trades, 32 Catering, 26 Laundry, 39 Cleaning and Portage. In addition there is a total staff of 60 at Alveston and Corio.

Laundry (Mr. R. Earls, Supervisor).—1,137,797 lbs. linen processed during the year.

Steam Raising (Engineer Mr. W. Bedgood).—1512 tons fuel used to produce 20,240,000 lbs. of steam.

Catering (Caterer Mr. H. Burchell).—Processed and served 56,892 meals, using 69,946 lbs Meat, 13,193 gallons of Milk, 89,674 lbs. Fruit and Vegetables, 27,364 lbs. Bread.

Cleaning (Mrs. E. Dawson, Domestic Supervisor).—With a total floor area of 113,000 square feet requires 68,640 man hours cleaning and portage annually.

CARE OF THE AGED:

Alveston and Corio Homes and Wards 4, 6, and 7 provide facilities for the care of 146 aged sick and infirm and our waiting list has not decreased. Staff spare no effort to give happiness and contentment to our patients although we are aware that no place can be quite like home, but many have no home to which they could go even if health permitted.

Matron T. Surrige (Alveston) and Matron F. Hammond (Corio) and Ward Charge Sisters are contributing a most worthwhile service.

Practical well-wishers, whose support has been most valuable and appreciated, have been Church Organisations, Fletcher Jones and Staff, Service Clubs and many individual friends.

MEALS ON WHEELS:

Community service to our aged has been augmented by the introduction of this valuable service supervised by a local voluntary Committee. Meals are provided ex Hospital kitchen with voluntary drivers providing delivery. The list of participants, each medically needy, is 38 with an average of 34 deliveries daily.

APPEAL:

Personal effort and initiative by 3YB Staff headed by Mr. E. Collings, Manager, and Mr. D. Swinson, Studio Manager, aroused public interest in the needs of hospitals and achieved an excellent record Appeal total of £28,482, of which Warrnambool Base received £10,984, and Alveston Home £1,263 and Corio Home £1,289.

We express appreciation to our competition candidates — Base Hospital, Mrs. E. Dodds and Mr. R. Tester; Alveston Home, Miss M. Clink and Mr. L. McNeil and Corio Home, Mrs. J. Giblin and Mr. G. Pimblett.

ANNUAL MEETING:

At our last Annual Meeting our Guest Speaker was Mr. R. L. Thomas, Commissioner of the Hospitals Commission.

Opportunity was taken to present Life Governor Certificates to — Mrs. L. Dawson, Mrs. N. Harris, Mrs. A. Hassett, Mrs. M. Lumsden, Mrs. R. McDonald, Mr. P. T. Parker, for signal service over a long period of years in the interest of patients in the Hospital.

A certificate of appreciation was also presented to Hospital Staff Auxiliary for large sums raised for development and loyal services over many years and this was accepted by Mr. W. Layther, President.

CONCLUSION:

I am aware that the Hospital has a great many friends whose names do not appear in the foregoing report and I desire to associate them also in acknowledgments made and appreciation expressed for many acts of goodwill towards the Hospital.

Our Press and Radio supported functions and events with a striking amount of valuable publicity. This is sincerely appreciated as good public relations demand an informed community.

The tedium of period of illness was relieved by Red Cross Diversional Therapy Group and Red Cross Library attendant and many other organisations.

To Mr. George Mathieson, who has been an inspiring influence in association with Nestles in the Nestle's Social Club Christmas Treat over many years, we offer sincere thanks and best wishes for happiness in his retirement.

To fellow members of the Committee I express appreciation for loyal and virile support and continued interest in the welfare of the Hospital.

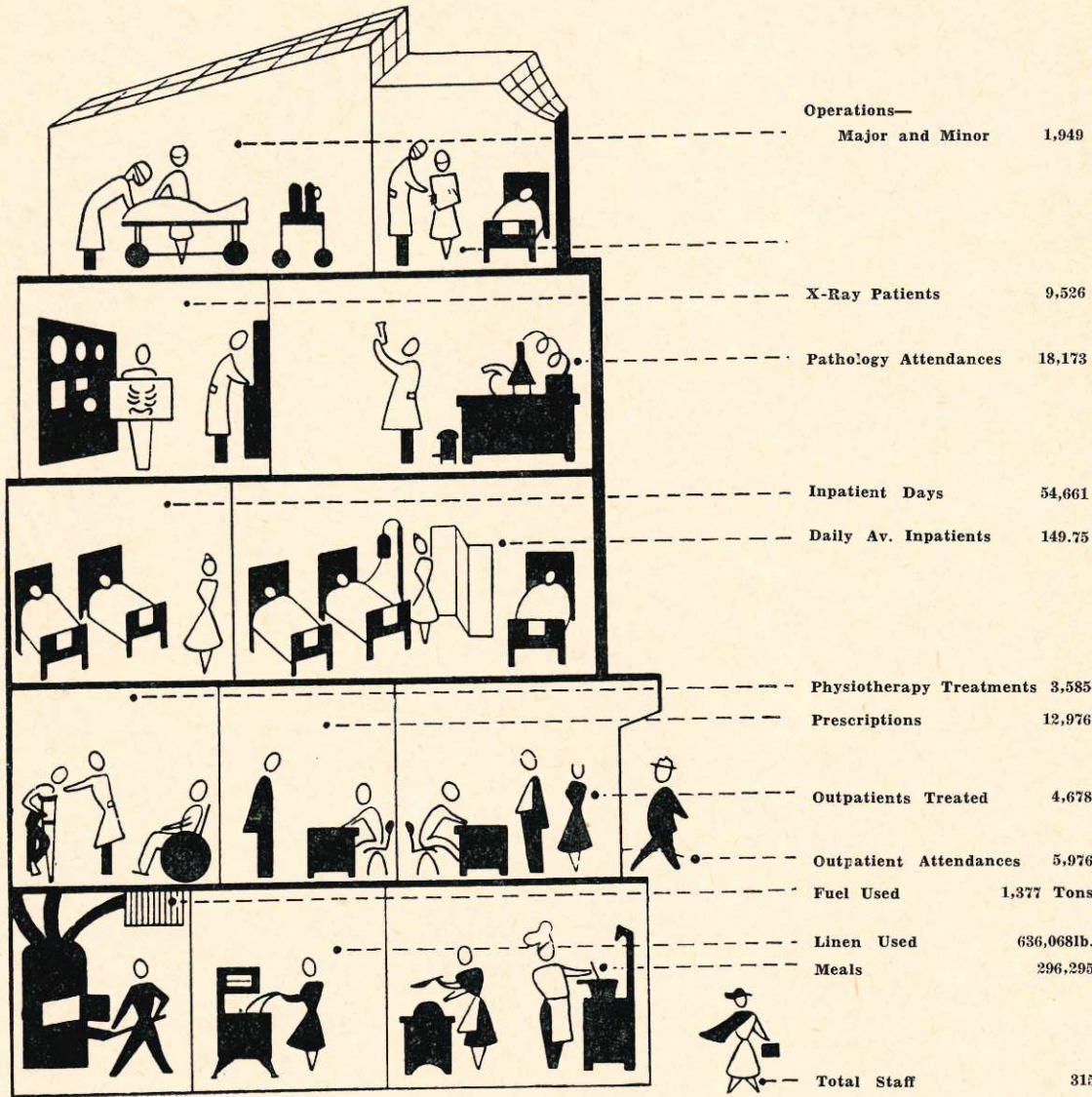
