115th Annual Report, 1968-1969

To The Life Governors and Contributors . . .

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I have the honour to present on behalf of the Committee of Management the 115th Annual Report and audited financial statements for the year ended 30th June 1969, covering the Base Hospital, Alveston and Corio.

Such reports present in the main the financial aspects of the Institutions. However, statistics also are a vital part of records of a Hospital. Unlike a business they represent people and their health problems and reflect our main objective of caring for the needs of our Community in terms of saving life, relief of suffering and rehabilitation of incapacitated of all ages. All our physical and professional resources revolve around the accomplishment of these aims and the discharge of this obligation.

Thus a Hospital is a constantly changing organisation. Change not only in physical terms of building and equipment but responsibility at various staff levels where there is a constant upgrading of standards to meet the changing and complex character of Medical diagnosis and treatment.

BUILDING CONSTRUCTION

The highlight of the year was the completion and occupation of our new Cafeteria and Dining area. Total cost was approx., \$60,000. It was constructed to link existing Dining area with existing main Kitchen. From the Kitchen the Cafeteria food service is supplied directly to the staff, or to the electrically heated food trollies which serve the patients in nine wards.

The Cafeteria seats 217 and has a pleasing non-institutional design and layout. This new Unit has given an uplift in food service by improving presentation and range of meals available. Notable features are the piped music, suitably modulated with continuous playing time without repeat for 28 hours. Also convenient pass-through units from Kitchen to servery area for refrigerated and hot food.

PRIVATE AND INTERMEDIATE WING

The extension of Private Wards onto balcony areas to provide toilet shower and Sunroom facilities for seven patients and modernisation of lighting, heating and installation of piped Oxygen and Suction was carried out. These units had been in such popular demand that further renovations are under consideration by the Board. However any such plan of upgrading facilities will require considerable planning to avoid excessive discomfort to patients in this busily functioning section.

Several smaller constructions include a new Splint room, additional toilets on Mezzanine floor, together with renewals, renovations and repairs in many departments. Two additional flats for Resident Medical staff have been planned and Tenders let for construction.

FINANCES

With a lump sum allocation in the final part of the year our figures are balanced at 30th June but there has been much anxiety during the past 12 months because of constantly rising wages awards and to meet such situations in the future a new financial formula is overdue.

Our expenditure was \$1,173,474 and Income \$1,200,204 showing Surplus of \$26,730. Our cost per day to treat a patient rose from \$15.84 to \$17.15. The fees charged to patients represented 53.7% proportion of total Income. Collection rate of fees on Private and Intermediate were 96.4% and Public 78.6%.



Present conditions emphasize the need for adequate rates of coverage by all patients under Benefits schemes with assistance both to patients individually financing their illness and to Hospital finances. A long period in Hospital for an uninsured or an under insured patient could be disastrous. In common with commerce and industry, Hospitals feel the impact of rising costs of commodities and wage rises granted by wage Tribunals and national cost of living rises. Hospital Administration must retain high ideals when dealing with Community personal problems but it cannot ignore business realism. Hospital care and treatment with its high degree of personal attention more quickly reflects rises in wages and whilst industry may look to the consumer for additional charges, Hospital managements desire at all costs to avoid further rises in fees and can only look to Government Grants to bridge deficits. Strict and accurate budgeting with no profit motive is essential in all departments to secure best possible treatment in a most effective and economical way and yet retain warm humanity and understanding. Therefore, relationship between needs and resources is a great Committee problem.

The Commonwealth Health Scheme was introduced in January 1969, improving Nursing Home Benefits for Bedfast patients, providing long term benefits in acute Hospitals for stays in excess of three months, and acceptance of pre-existing ailments.

STATISTICS

Our Daily Average has risen from 148.8 (1967), 156.3 (1968), to 161.2 (1969). The number of Inpatients treated, rose from 4645 to 4923 and Outpatients and Casualty attendances rose from 29083 to 30423.

Our vastly improving facilities in Casualty have enabled greater numbers to be treated expeditiously and the new Theatre in Casualty has been used daily.

Our main Ward inpatient accommodation has frequently been overtaxed and it is obvious that in the near future it will become inadequate for acute patients without reduction of the number of aged patients in Wards 4, 6 and 7 and the conversion of some of these beds for acute treatments.

Our reduction in daily stay is from 12.3 to 12. Operations performed Major 791, Minor 1752, and other items of statistics are printed elsewhere in this report.

HOSPITALS & CHARITIES COMMISSION

Appreciation is expressed to Dr. J.H. Lindell, Chairman, members of the Commission, Executive Officers and staff for a further year of service and practical support. The friendly co-operative spirit and understanding which the Commission displays assists greatly in our problems.

VOLUNTARY SERVICES

The Committee gratefully acknowledges the services of Honorary Medical staff and the skill and attention so freely and unselfishly bestowed. The Community in the lower income bracket benefits greatly from this vital service. Our progress is indicated by the increasing scope of the Medical service being given.

It was with great regret that the resignations of Dr. F.J. Mouser and Dr. E.J. Rossiter were received when they decided to leave Warrnambool. Dr. Mouser was appointed as Honorary Obstetrician and Gynaecologist in 1955 and had thus served 14 years as an Honorary Medical Officer. Dr. Rossiter was appointed as Honorary Paediatrician in 1964 and showed a deep interest in human relationships, especially in the young age group.

Honorary Dental and Optometrists likewise joined in a most valuable contribution to health in our Community.

Consultative Clinics on a visiting basis, Peter MacCallum, Poliomyelitis, Psychiatric, Ear, Nose and Throat gave valued service and avoided costly and time consuming trips to the Capital city.

Spiritual welfare of patients has been in the comforting hands of the various denominations and regular contact is maintained.

Warrnambool Red Cross Groups provide Library services and diversional therapy having the effect of lessening the tedium of long hospitalisation and also improving manual dexterity.

Meals for Meals on Wheels are prepared at the Hospital and containers are distributed daily by voluntary drivers.

Service clubs show a keen interest in patient welfare and Nestles Social Club and other organisations maintain the spirit of Christmas Goodwill.

CARE OF THE AGED

Alveston and Corio Homes as well as Geriatric Wards 4, 6 and 7 have a constant bed occupancy exceeding 150 patients with a large waiting list. Our acute wards also have a complement of aged and handicapped with a slow rate of transfer. There is little prospect of discharge of our aged with continuity of domiciliary care. These groups are of advanced age and many have no relatives or home. The problem of adequate care is becoming increasingly difficult and every effort is necessary to encourage aged people to retain their full dignity and independence by remaining in their own homes as long as possible. Institutional care can only be a second-best substitute. The tendency of increase of life expectation with an increase of aged admissions in Hospital is viewed with concern as our obligation is to some 70,000 Residents in the Corangamite region where those of Pensionable age are in the vicinity of 12%. The Government closely examines additional aged beds as the initial capital cost is reasonable compared with the subsequent



maintenance at a high annual cost. Recent legislation to aid bedfast patients in Homes for the Aged will prove a benefit to a portion of patients at Alveston and Corio but does not apply to Wards, 4, 6 and 7. As mentioned in previous reports, we are concerned at the lack of sufficient and suitable accommodation in Victoria for the large group of long stay patients in the "young adult" group which includes young persons, who through traffic accidents, have suffered irreversible damage and also patients with such mental retardation that they are beyond home care. Staff gives unstintingly of time and effort to provide contentment to patients and several voluntary organisations notably Fletcher Jones Social club, Church groups and service clubs give support in the comfort of the aged.

AUXILIARIES

The Committee is privileged to pay a tribute to the excellent work of our 11 Auxiliaries. Each enthusiastically carries out its self-imposed task of raising finances to purchase important equipment which benefits patients for years to come and permits the Hospital, and its Medical and Nursing staff, to provide advanced methods of treatment. Of equal value is the tangible benefit of good community relationship and the promotion of goodwill which their interest engenders.

The Annual combined Auxiliaries Fete raised \$615.59 which was a valuable corporate effort. Auxiliaries raised funds by means of Dinner parties, authorised raffles, dances, street stalls, fetes, mannequin parades etc. The donations enabled us to acquire equipment as follows:—

BURSARIES

Bursary holders after completing their three year training periods have filled important positions in Speech Therapy Department — (Miss Margaret Allen), Physiotherapy — (Miss Janice Hill). We have granted current external training Bursaries for training in Medical Records, Physiotherapy and Speech Therapy.



Also internal training is undertaken for Radiographers, Certificated Medical Technicians, apprenticeship tradesmen and cooking.

Without such awards we would experience acute difficulty in recruiting Technical personnel in many departments and only this internal training can ensure continuity.

APPEAL

In concert with past years the Management and Staff of 3YB spared no effort in enthusiasm and efficiency to ensure the success of the 1969 Appeal. The district total raised was \$58,810 of which the Base Hospital received \$29,010.95, Alveston \$2,418.74, Corio \$2,443.75.

The Darby & Joan contest, conducted in such an able fashion by the Staff of 3YB was again a feature of this year's Appeal and the admirable efforts of all candidates is highly commendable. ADMINISTRATION

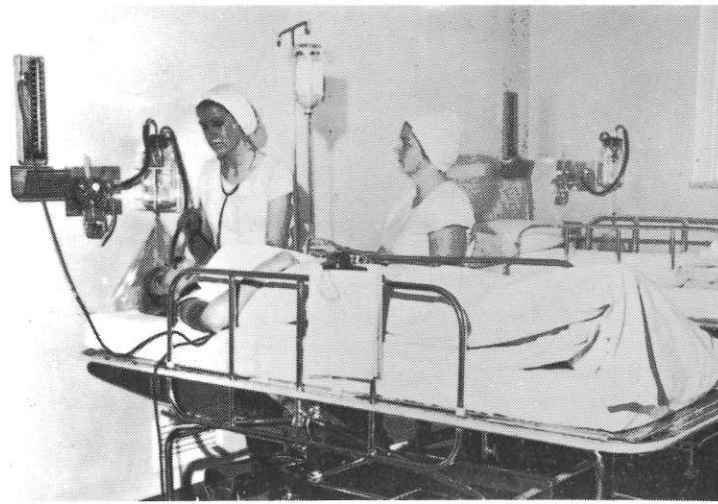
The Control Centre of this vast and highly complicated Hospital Machine is the office of our Manager-Secretary, Mr. Stewart Lindsay. From this office Mr. Lindsay most capably administers an operation worth over three million dollars, employing a staff of 485, and demanding the utmost in skilled and knowledgeable direction for its smooth and efficient operation.

Mr. Lindsay has not only the ability to efficiently and understandingly direct the day-to-day operations of this institution but has the more important attribute of planning for tomorrow. He has been an inspiration to the Committee of Management in this regard, and seldom does a meeting pass when there is not a discussion of some mooted extension or improvement to our buildings, equipment and staffing.

May I record on behalf of the Committee of Management our grateful appreciation of his services.

Dr. J.D. Reid, Medical Superintendent, successfully combines this important post with that of Pathologist. Dr. Reid is held in highest esteem in both capacities and he provides liaison with Medical staffs as well as a most effective contribution to patient care. Dr. Reid is also Chairman of the Infection Committee.

Miss June Stewart, Matron, maintains a high standard of Nursing care and carried out with efficiency her complex duties. Rapid changes in Medical and Nursing treatment impose considerable responsibility in suitable training procedures both Theoretical and Practical. Moves have also been made during this year to introduce in part new aspects of a Nurses Curriculum effecting a wider coverage of procedures than in previous Curricula with emphasis on the changing conditions of this day.



The Committee also records appreciation for loyal and effective services by Assistant Manager, Mr. A.E.W. Matthews, Deputy Matron Miss K. Taylor, Assistant Matron Sister W. Hawker, Accountant Mr. T. Hughes and Mr. S. Hando, also Executive Department Heads upon whom considerable responsibility for patients' welfare rests.

Mr. T. Hughes Accountant received congratulations upon his appointment as Manager/Secretary at Portland Hospital and took up his new position in December, 1968. Mr. S. Hando, Administrative Assistant, was promoted to Accountant and is carrying out duties in this position most capably.

STAFF CHANGES:

Miss Merle Easterbrook had been Chief Clerk for 15 years and resigned to take up a permanent Salvation Army appointment, and Mrs. M. McDonough was appointed Chief Clerk. Mrs. H. Young Domestic Supervisor retired after three years competent service. The Management also regrets losing the services of other loyal staff in Mr. R. Tinker Storeman (22 years), Mr. W. Johnson Wardsman (24 years), Mr. D.R. McDonald (19 years).

MEDICAL ANCILLARY DEPARTMENTS:

There has been considerable increase in range of volume of treatments in each of the following departments and staff constantly reappraises and reeducates to keep abreast of modern developments:— Pathology, X-Ray, Physiotherapy also Visiting Physiotherapist, Pharmacy, Visiting Nurse, Welfare Department. Miss Margaret Allen has re-established the operation of our Speech Therapy Department where there has been a considerable demand for this service from children overcoming Speech handicaps. Medical Records; Miss Marianne Meates has recently commenced duty, in this department, established for some 4 years, and catering for the growing acceptance of the need for the highest quality records of patients' illnesses and progress.

Our Ante-Natal Clinic and T.B. Clinic continued their services during this year.

LIFE GOVERNORS:

At the August Annual meeting the Committee honoured the following for signal service in the interest of Hospital patients by electing them Life Governors — Mrs. B. Taylor (Warrnambool Past Trainees), Mrs. A. Thorpe (Junior Ladies Auxiliary), Mr. A.W.R. Lewis (Past President, Board of Management), Dr. K.W. Longton, Mr. A.L. Anderson and Mr. D.M. Dickson.

SAFETY COMMITTEE:

The Committee records its appreciation of the sustained activity of this Committee which meets monthly to review Hospital safety against hazards of fire and accident. A great many valuable recommendations by this Advisory Committee have been approved and acted upon by the Board. Members have widened their knowledge by inviting inspections by the Factories Inspector, Fire Brigade, S.E.C., and other allied safety advisors. Investigations covered Alveston and Corio as well as Base Hospital.

The successful evacuation exercise, co-operating Nursing staff, Police, Fire Brigade, Ambulance service, Search and Rescue Squad was held December 1968 with Boy Scouts suitably prepared as evacuee patients.

ELECTRONIC DATA PROCESSING (E.D.P.)

There is an increasing awareness within the Hospital that in the not too distant future, Computers will play, as they are doing overseas, significant roles in Clinical and Administrative practice. In sections of City Hospitals the capacity of modern Computers with their memory banks, capable of producing masses of Data at high speed, are in early stages of experimentation and such programmes are expanding.

Since January, we commenced a Pilot scheme, by forwarding data from Medical Records Department to the Computer at Monash University. Early indications are that this will prove most valuable in providing additional statistical information, such as diagnosis, incidence of diseases, and patterns of illness, beyond the capacity of our staff to handle manually. We need to improve transcription and condensed information to make maximum use of computers, keeping in mind that Accounting procedures such as Pay Roll Processes, General Ledger, Budget Control etc., will become accepted practice. In the meantime an active programme of familiarisation of programming is being undertaken by Senior Staff.

CONCLUSION:

The preceding reports have given some indication of the growing demand upon our services and the effort made to give suitable service as required.

I am gratefully aware that countless people contribute to the welfare of the Hospital in varied ways, some in donations, some in voluntary service, some in kind and aggregate a large volume of voluntary support. Without this the Hospital would be very much less effective.

The Board records its appreciation to all staffs for continued co-operation and contribution in a true spirit of service which prevails in the Hospital where the good of the patients comes first.

Our appreciation to His Worship the Mayor, Cr. H. Stephenson and Shire President, Mr. J. McConnell for their interest at all times but especially at Christmas and Appeal periods. Also to the Warrnambool Standard, 3YB and Television for a valuable liaison with our public.

We have been pleased to receive visits to the Hospital from so many interested people, eminent Medical Visitors, School Children and service club groups and our facilities have been frequently used by many observers in under-Graduate and Post-Graduate studies.

My personal thanks to each Sub-Committee Chairman and Committee member for splendid co-operation.

Increased demands have been placed upon the Nursing Service during the past 12 months due to an increase in the daily average of patients treated and at times the high bed occupancy.

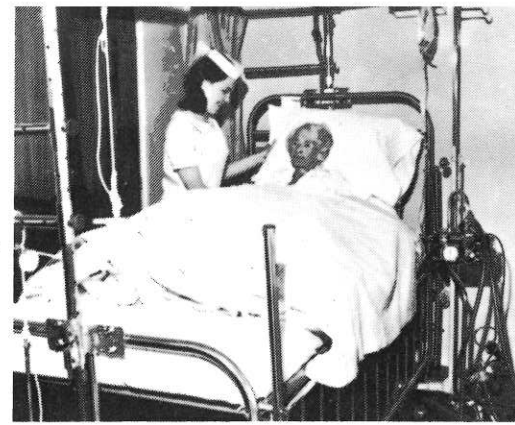

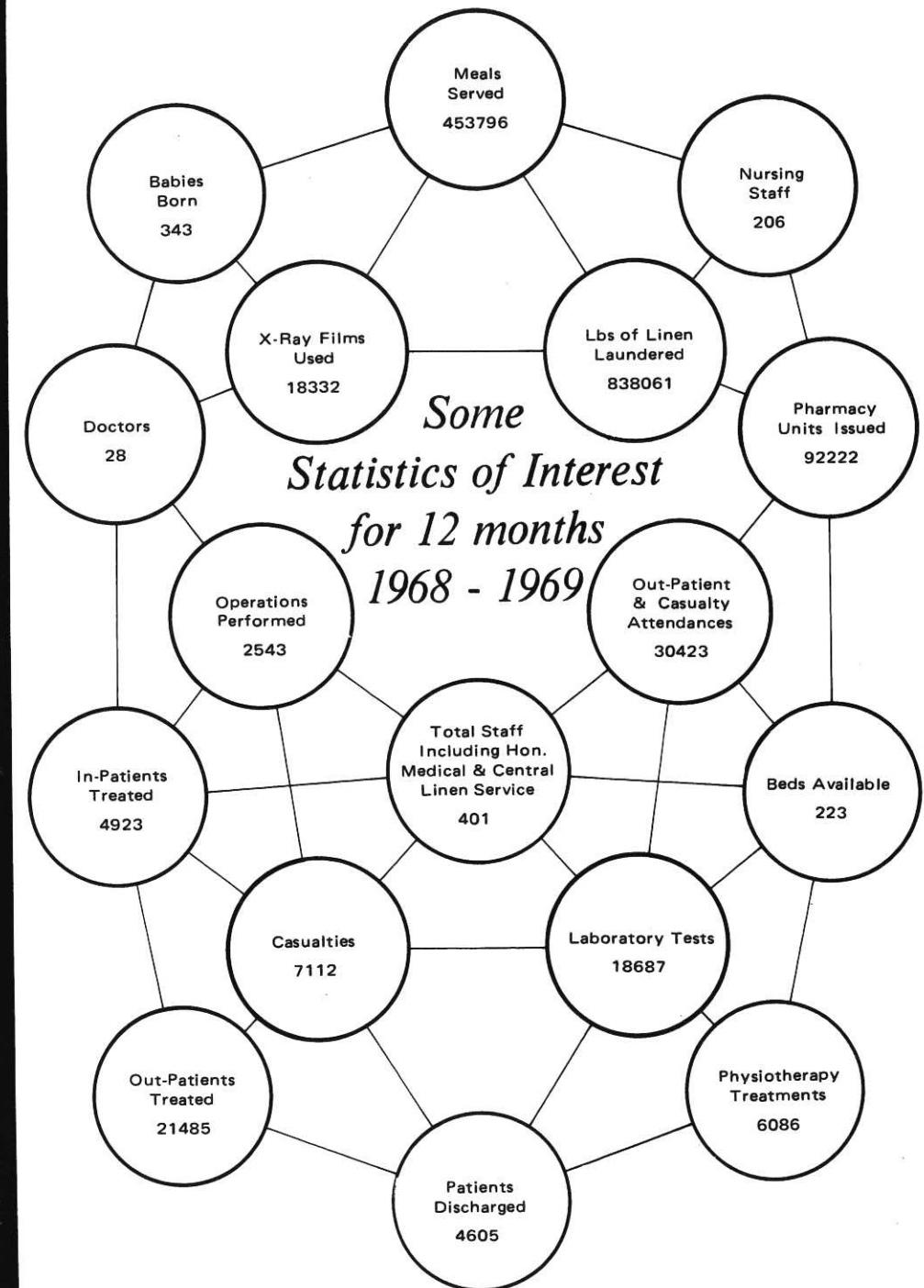
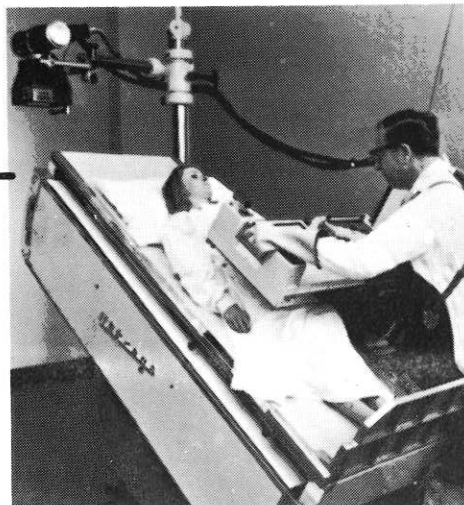
The Hospital Auxiliaries and Beecham Research Laboratories have donated equipment during the year and we thank them for their generosity.

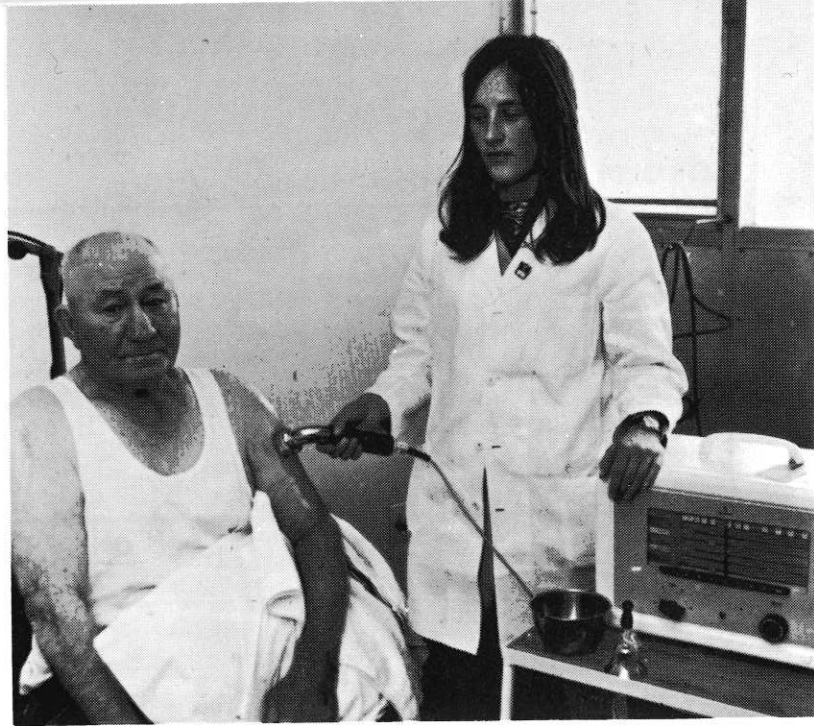

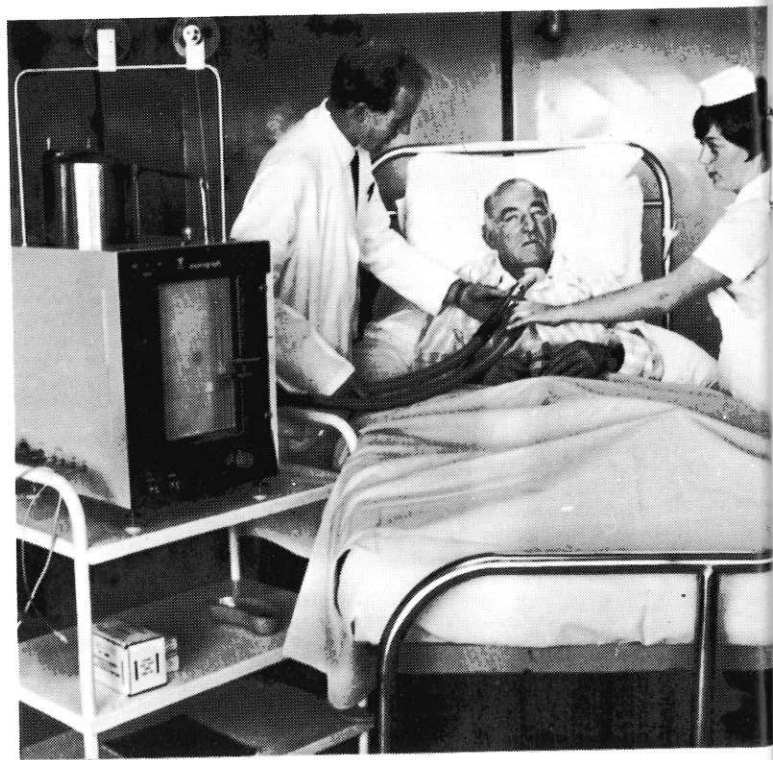
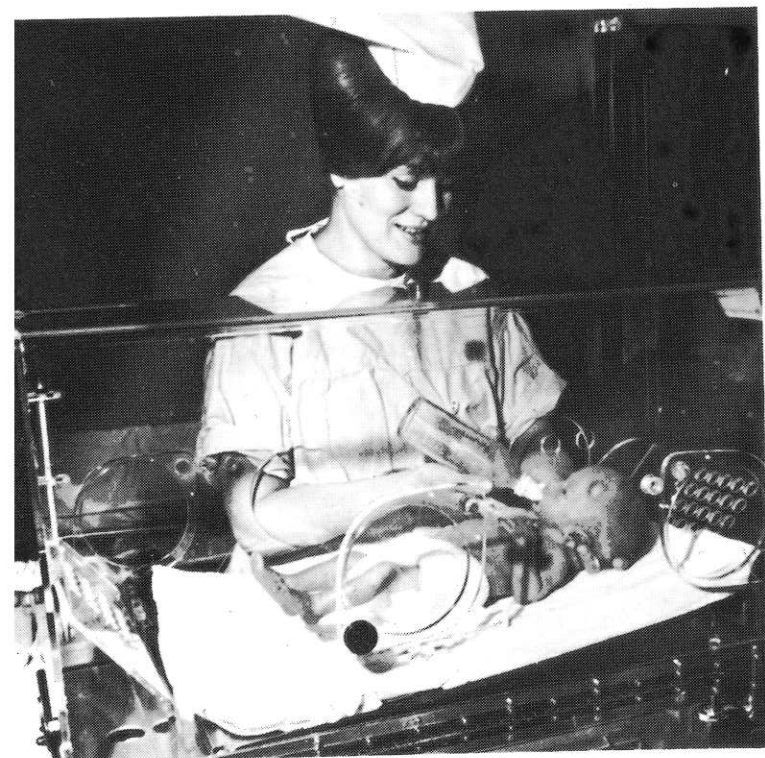
