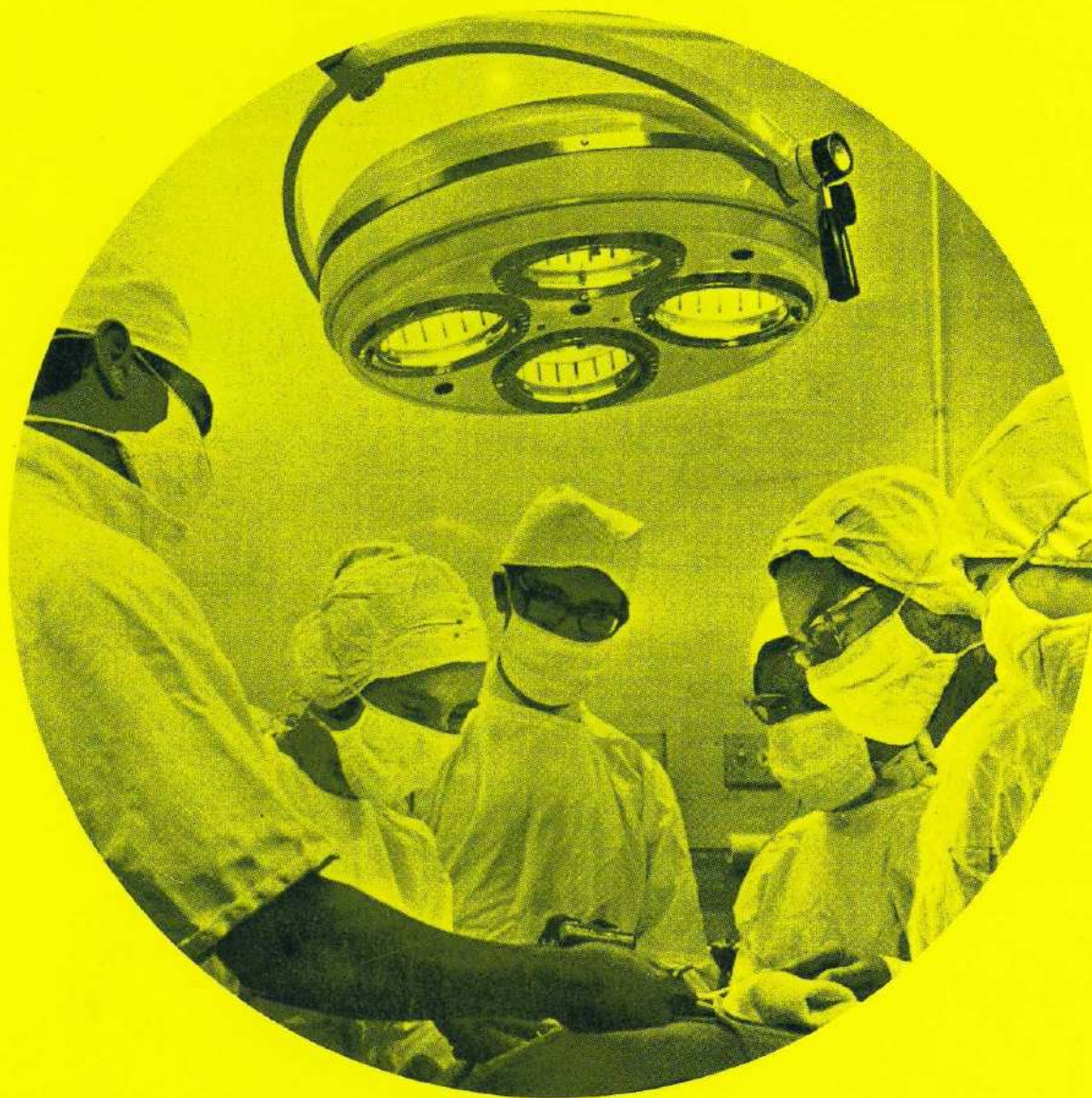

# 116th Annual Report, 1969-1970

## To The Life Governors and Contributors . . .

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I have the honour to present on behalf of the Committee of Management the 116th Annual Report and Audited Financial Statements for the year ended 30th June, 1970. These cover the Base Hospital, Alveston and Corio.

In addition to the financial aspect presented, I would emphasize that our basic objective is the need of this community in terms of saving life, relief of pain and sickness and rehabilitation of the incapacitated of all age groups plus a widening range of high standard services. No day passes without comment in the press on health care and this is clear recognition of a heightened sensitivity to health problems and a demand for high quality scientific patient care for all. Therefore, the entire physical resources and professional skills of the Hospital are directed towards the accomplishing of these aims and discharge of this obligation.

### BUILDING PLANS:—

Activity has been directed towards planning the construction of a six bed Intensive Care Ward to be built on the western side of our Multi-Storey building leading from Surgical floor one.

This has close proximity on the same floor to Operating Theatres, Recovery unit and Central Sterile Department. Plans have been completed and Tenders sought at the date of writing this report, but construction not commenced. The Intensive Care Unit is for patients requiring short term Intensive treatment for a critical state of illness as compared with ward units for more prolonged and routine care of the seriously ill and also recovery units for recovery from Anaesthetic state after Theatre procedure. Such units require constant and undivided attention of skilled nurses, frequent medical supervision and use of special electronic equipment for the particular function of patient monitoring. The unit is planned to cover Intensive care, Coronary care and one bed for isolation.

Private and Intermediate wing constructed in 1938 is in planning stage for complete modernisation. This will be in four stages increasing patient toilets, bathing and Sunroom areas and upgrading facilities. The carrying out of such a plan presents special problems to avoid discomfort to patients in this busily functioning section.

Two additional flats for Resident Medical Officers have been completed.

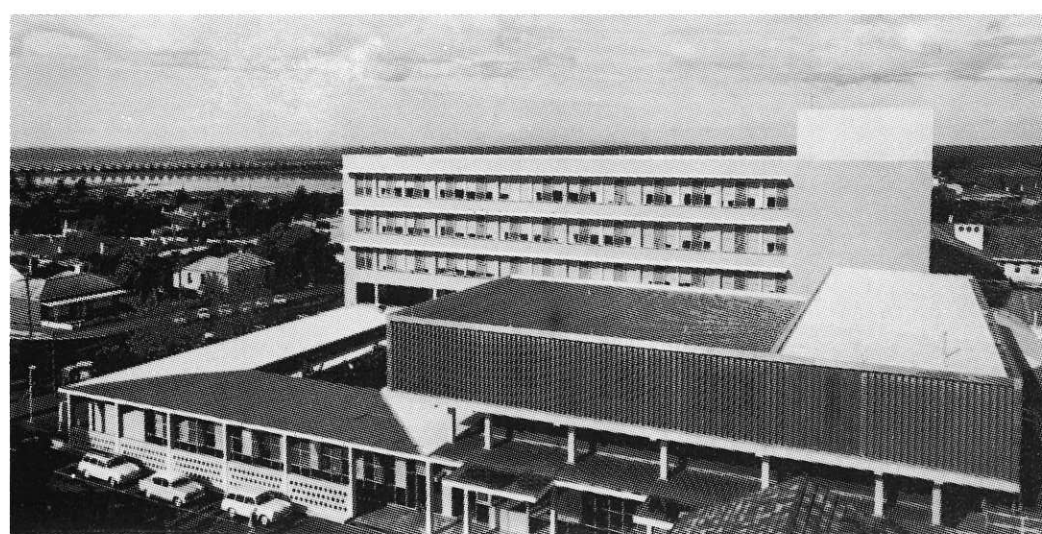
Fire Escape stair from Private wing is being erected and Speech Therapy Department and School of Nursing had minor renovations.

A plan for future improvements has been prepared, programmed over 15 years.

### COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT:—

The following members retire by effluxion of time but being eligible submit themselves for re-election. This excepts Mr. J. McD. Taylor who will not seek re-election for health reasons. He has been a member of the Board since 1931 and Past President, Treasurer and Honorary Solicitor and his wise counsel will be greatly missed.

#### HOSPITALS & CHARITIES COMMISSION:—

Appreciation is expressed to Dr. J.H. Lindell, Chairman of the Commission, Executive Officers and staff for a further year of service and practical support. Our requests have been met with co-operation and understanding and a generous policy as funds allow, has been adopted towards our financial needs.

#### FINANCE:—

Our income was \$1,296,966 and Expenditure \$1,299,696 showing a deficit of \$2,730.

The deficit is due to an alteration in the method of presenting our annual figures, which is in accordance with Hospital & Charities Commission instructions. Income from Public, Motor Car Accident, Workers Compensation, Repatriation and Out-Patient Fees must be cash received only and this has resulted in a writing down of income in these categories of \$14,395. Figures are presented in detail elsewhere in this report.

The need for adequate benefits cover cannot be over emphasised both to finance patients illness and its effect upon Hospital income. A long period of Hospitalization for an un-insured or under-insured patient could be disastrous.

The advent of Subsidized Medical Services for low income groups has proved most beneficial to that group.

#### STATISTICS:—

Daily Average of Inpatients over past four years has been:-

148.8 (1967), 156.3 (1968), 161.2 (1969) and 170.6 (1970), showing the increased demand upon beds.

Number of patients treated declined slightly from 4,923 to 4,846.

Outpatients and Casualty attendances rose from 30,423 to 38,251. Casualty Department facilities are increasing in use and Theatre in Casualty is being used daily.

Operations performed, Major 789, Minor 1,729. Other statistics are printed elsewhere in this report.

Corio Daily Average Inpatients 46.6 (47 beds),

Alveston Daily Average Inpatients 32.9 (33 beds).

#### HONORARY SERVICES:—

The important part of any Hospital is the work for patients and the success of its patient care. In this regard our Honorary Medical staff have contributed unstintingly and have given generously of time and skill.

The Board records its deep regret at the death of Dr. W.R. Angus on 28th March, 1970 after an illness extending over some months. Dr. Angus had served as Honorary Ophthalmologist and later as Consultant since 1939. Our sincere sympathy is extended to Mrs. Angus and family.

The resignations of Dr. R.M. Powrie (Ophthalmologist) and Dr. T.J. Leonard (Psychiatrist), were received during the year as they left Warrnambool. Dr. K. Meagher (Psychiatrist) appointed in April, 1970 and Dr. K. Higham (Honorary Ophthalmologist) (Now Deceased) 1/1/70. New Honorary appointments were Dr. J. Richardson as Oral Surgeon and Dr. G.F. Rich gave Honorary service over a two months period.

Honorary Dentists and Optometrists joined with Medical staff in a most valuable contribution to health in our community.

Consultation Clinics on a Visiting basis were Peter MacCallum, Poliomyelitis, Psychiatric, Ear, Nose and Throat and a Visiting service for Orthodontic treatment to teeth was commenced and all gave valued service and avoided cost and time consuming trips to the capital city.

Spiritual welfare of patients has been in the comforting hands of the various denominations and regular contact is maintained.

Meals on Wheels service is organised under a separate Committee but meals supplied through the Hospital and the number issued since commencement has reached almost 40,000.

Voluntary service was contributed by Warrnambool Red Cross Branches through Library service and Craft work and the service clubs and Nestle Social Club assisted to make Christmas a bright and happy time for our patients.

#### REGIONAL SCHEME:—

This has been in operation for fifteen years, and has as its objective the opportunity of improved patient care to all citizens, however remote geographically, and has met with considerable success. Some Hospitals are so placed geographically that they serve their immediate community and the Base has a wide spread area to provide central services or disperse specialised service.

New moves to strengthen the plan are under discussion and Pilot Schemes are to be introduced.

#### BURSARIES:—

Only by granting bursaries can country Base Hospitals achieve staff security and we have two Physiotherapy and one Speech Therapy student in training.

#### SERVICE DEPARTMENTS:—

An Annual Report would be incomplete without reference to the indispensable work of our large staff in various service departments:—

Engineering (Mr. W.A. Bedgood), and his department provide continuous supplies of steam and hot water and maintain buildings and equipment.

Catering Officer, (Mr. F. Kelly) and his department, responsible for preparation and distribution of more than 460,665 meals each year.

Domestic Supervisor (Mrs. J. Horwood) and her staff maintain a very high standard of cleanliness and attractiveness.

Laundry Supervisor (Mr. R. Earl) controls a large business venture providing full laundry service to approximately 1,000 beds in fourteen Warrnambool & District Hospitals. This necessitates processing almost two million pounds of linen annually and with delivery on a thrice weekly basis.



#### CARE OF THE AGED:

The need of suitable and sufficient care has never been more acute than in 1970. Demands for infirm beds remain very high, greatly above the possibility of admission. We have a Waiting List of seventy people and it is almost unjust to accept further names and raise false hopes. From the demand which comes by letter and personal interview from neighbouring regions, their situation is similar.

As these applications are mostly from those of advanced age groups, many with no relations to care for them, little relief can be made available from Domiciliary services. Meals on Wheels is Warrnambool based only and not district, likewise the Council Home Help and Hospital Visiting Nurse Service, therefore, only additional beds is the requirement despite the initial establishment cost and the heavy maintenance cost thereafter. We stress the urgency of the Lyndoch Scheme to provide infirm beds. Our provision of 80 at Alveston and Corio and 64 at the Base Hospital special wards are not adequate and the acute wards have also an additional quota causing bed shortages for accident cases.

Recent Commonwealth Legislation has been of financial assistance to the patients of Corio and Alveston but it does not apply to patients in Wards 4, 6 and 7. Staff in the five areas give unstintingly of time and effort to provide contentment to patients and Fletcher Jones Social Club, Church groups, Service clubs, give personal comfort and financial support to the aged.

During the year Alveston has added additional bath and toilet facilities at the Home at a cost of \$4,000.

#### EQUIPMENT:-

Much equipment has been added during this year including, Evaporative cooling systems to the Tutoring Department and Laundry, new Toledo Berkel Mixer, Kitchen, Laundry Tumbling machine and folding machine at combined cost of \$13,000 also new equipment for compressors and water pumps valued at \$2,600.

X-Omat Automatic Film Processor for X-Ray with its silver recovery unit attached improves work flow and increases productivity. This unit develops X-Ray film in 90 seconds dry and ready for viewing.

#### AUXILIARIES:-

Each year the Committee is pleased to pay its tribute to the excellent work of 11 Auxiliaries. Each is enthusiastic and carries out its self imposed task of raising finance to purchase important equipment to benefit our patients for many years to come. Of equal value is the tangible benefit of community relationship promoting goodwill which they engender. Their functions were many and varied including stalls, fetes, card evenings, dinner dances and resulted in the purchase of following equipment:-

Very considerable number of costly items for Pathology Department, Croupaire - Childrens floor, Hi-Lo beds and Ripple Mattresses, Hydraulic bath lift and Oxygen and Suction installation.

#### LIFE GOVERNORS:-

At the last Annual meeting, the Committee honoured the following for signal service in the interest of our patients by electing them Life Governors:

#### APPEAL:-

The Management and staff of 3YB gave liberally of air-time and personally to ensure a successful Appeal. From this enthusiasm and hard work, a district total of \$61,165 of which the Base Hospital received \$23,783, Corio \$1,327, and Alveston \$1,287.

We record grateful appreciation to our Darby and Joan Candidates and their supporting Committee's who raised the following substantial amounts :-

#### ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF:-

Mr. S.A. Lindsay - our Manager & Secretary - has continued to administer the Hospital in a very capable and efficient manner. Because of his leadership and skills the day to day operation of the Hospital has proceeded smoothly. We have finished the Financial Year with a relatively small Deficit and we are continuing on forward planning to add further facilities and to improve others. On behalf of the Board of Management I would like to thank Mr. Lindsay.

Dr. J.D. Reid, Medical Superintendent, successfully combines two most important posts as he carries out most competently his duties as Pathologist. In this combined appointment, Dr. Reid provides excellent liaison with Medical staffs and in both capacities is held in very high esteem.

Supervisory responsibility has been added by the increase in number of Resident Medical Officers to four, one Senior, three Junior, and the obligation imposed that each has training opportunities available in widening knowledge prior to entering private practice. Dr. Reid has also been appointed Admitting Officer and in conjunction with R.M.O.'s will endeavour to cover this important task of bed allocation which is becoming increasingly difficult with our larger daily intake and discharge of patients.

Miss June Stewart, Matron, has maintained high standards of Nursing care and training in both general and Nursing Aide Schools in spite of changes of personnel of Executive Status. The shortened stay of each patient is one of the factors imposing pressure on the Nurses as treatment is essentially more concentrated. Whilst we have been fortunate to avoid the acute shortages in Nursing qualifications experienced in some parts of this state, we find as in other areas that with the present higher educational basis, nursing faces competition from many other sources of recruitment. Personnel selection and theoretical and practical training must be maintained at a high standard.



CENTRAL STERILE SUPPLY DEPARTMENT

The Committee also records appreciation for loyal and effective service of Assistant Manager, Mr. A. Matthews, Deputy Matron, Miss K. Taylor, Assistant Matron Sister W. Hawker, also other executive Departmental Heads. Mr. S. Hando, Accountant, is furthering his Bachelor of Health Administration at University of N.S.W. and we appreciate the services of Mr. Ivan Stanway, Relieving Officer, Hospitals Commission, who is carrying out his duties.

**MEDICAL ANCILLARY DEPARTMENTS:—**

There has been considerable increase in the range and volume of treatments in each of the following departments and staff attend conferences of necessary re-education to keep abreast of swiftly changing methods of treatment:—

Pathology, X-Ray, Physiotherapy, Pharmacy, Welfare Department.

In our Speech Therapy Department, Miss Margaret Allen has transferred to a city Hospital and Miss Margaret Stone has taken up her appointment. In Medical Records, Miss Marianne Meates has transferred to Bendigo Base Hospital and Miss Barbara Armstrong is carrying out the important duties in this department. Our Ante-Natal Clinic and T.B. Clinic, continued their services during the year.

**PUBLICITY:—**

This report would be incomplete without an expression of appreciation to Warrnambool Standard, 3YB, BTV 6, for favourable news coverage, as each assists to raise our public image in the minds of those we serve.

**EGG APPEAL:—**

The Annual Egg Appeal, which was commenced by the Editor of The Warrnambool Standard in 1911 Mr. W. Britton Harvey, still continues year by year and our appreciation is due to district school children and their teachers for continued co-operation in the conduct of this effort. The number of eggs delivered to the hospital kitchen during the period of this Appeal in September and October of 1969 was 1,003 Dozen.

**COMPUTER SERVICES:**

As indicated in 1969 Report, we commenced in January, 1969 a programme concentrated on Medical Records being processed through an on-line Computer at Monash University. This provides additional information which is classified, sorted and summarised, of the incidence of diseases and patterns of illness beyond the capacity of our staff to handle manually. Mr. Allan Matthews, Assistant Manager, has been appointed Electronic Data Processing Officer and further investigations and familiarization with processes are proceeding particularly of speedy means of communication to and from Melbourne. These must be improved before increasing our scope to Payroll processes and creditors also Inpatient recording. However, the increase in volume of procedures in our Hospital can only be coped with in the future by the use of Computers with their ability to process masses of data at high speed and yet retain this information in its memory bank as required.

**CONCLUSION:—**

Whilst the word 'Hospital' brings to mind, concrete, steel, also corridors and beds, this is only the static half of the story. A Hospital is a living place with people caring for people. Management mobilises the skills and efforts of these widely divergent groups to provide personalised service to individual patients. Teams and individuals working at all levels recognise that the performance of each person is dependent upon other persons for satisfactory conclusion of their particular responsibility.

It is a rewarding experience to act as President and be able to appreciate the fellowship and co-operation with fellow Board members and with staff.

The Board appreciates the continued support and assistance given by so many members of the community we serve and we seek their continued interest.

May I express to Committee Chairmen, Members of Board, Professional and other staffs, appreciation for splendid support. May we be inspired to maintain a similar progressive policy in the year to come.

Medical Superintendent's Report . . .

This has been a busy year in the Hospital. Bed occupancy has been high and doctors and ancillary services have been treating or investigating more patients. In spite of this, the enthusiasm and keenness apparent within the Hospital has been gratifying. Patient care is recognised as being of a high standard and I think that the community can be proud of the Hospital. Plans for a six bedded Intensive Care ward have been passed. When completed this will improve the concentrated care needed for the acute coronary patient and the acute surgical patient. The "Aberdeen system" of prescribing and recording the issuing of drugs was introduced. This system has been shown to reduce errors of omission and commission in the issuing of drugs, and is another safety feature.

**Honorary Medical Staff** — The Honorary Medical Staff though reduced in numbers have been most loyal and unstinting in their services to the Hospital. The community does not fully appreciate how much free service is given by the Honorary staff. I regret to report the death of Dr. W.R. Angus and Dr. K. Higham.

Dr. (Roy) Angus was a prominent figure in medical circles and was a member of our staff for Thirty-one years. Although he practised general surgery his main interest in later years was Ophthalmology. He was a pioneer in the use of the Intrasceral Cartilage Implant which resulted in cosmetically better artificial eyes. His work was recognised by the Ophthalmological Society of Australasia and workers in U.S.A., New Zealand and Australia have adopted the principles of "the Angus operation". The fact that a country practitioner can be a pioneer in specialised surgery is an inspiration to us all.

Dr. K. Higham was specialist Ophthalmologist for five months until his tragic death. Although he was not with us for long we appreciated the high standard of his work.

**Changes in the Staff** — Dr. M. Powrie was appointed Specialist Ophthalmologist in New Guinea and left in December. He was a popular member of our staff and we wish him well in his new sphere. Dr. T. Leonard, Psychiatrist was transferred to Melbourne and we welcomed Dr. Meagher as our consulting Psychiatrist.

**R.M.O.** — Dr. P. McCann, S.R.M.O. was appointed Registrar in Radiology at Alfred Hospital. Dr. M. Giles returned to the R.A.A.F. after a satisfactory year in Warrnambool. Dr. E. Fairbank was appointed S.R.M.O. after finishing his first year. His work has been outstanding. We increased the number of Junior R.M.O.'s and now have three, Dr. Monro, Dr. Au and Dr. Peterson. Now that we have four resident Doctors more time is available for patient care and for R.M.O. training.

Throughout the year we had our usual guest speakers and discussions. In particular we welcomed Dr. Alan Kerr, Gastroenterologist, Adelaide, Professor Dudley and the Monash Surgical Group, The Royal Australasian College of Physicians, and representatives of the Post Graduate Medical Committee.

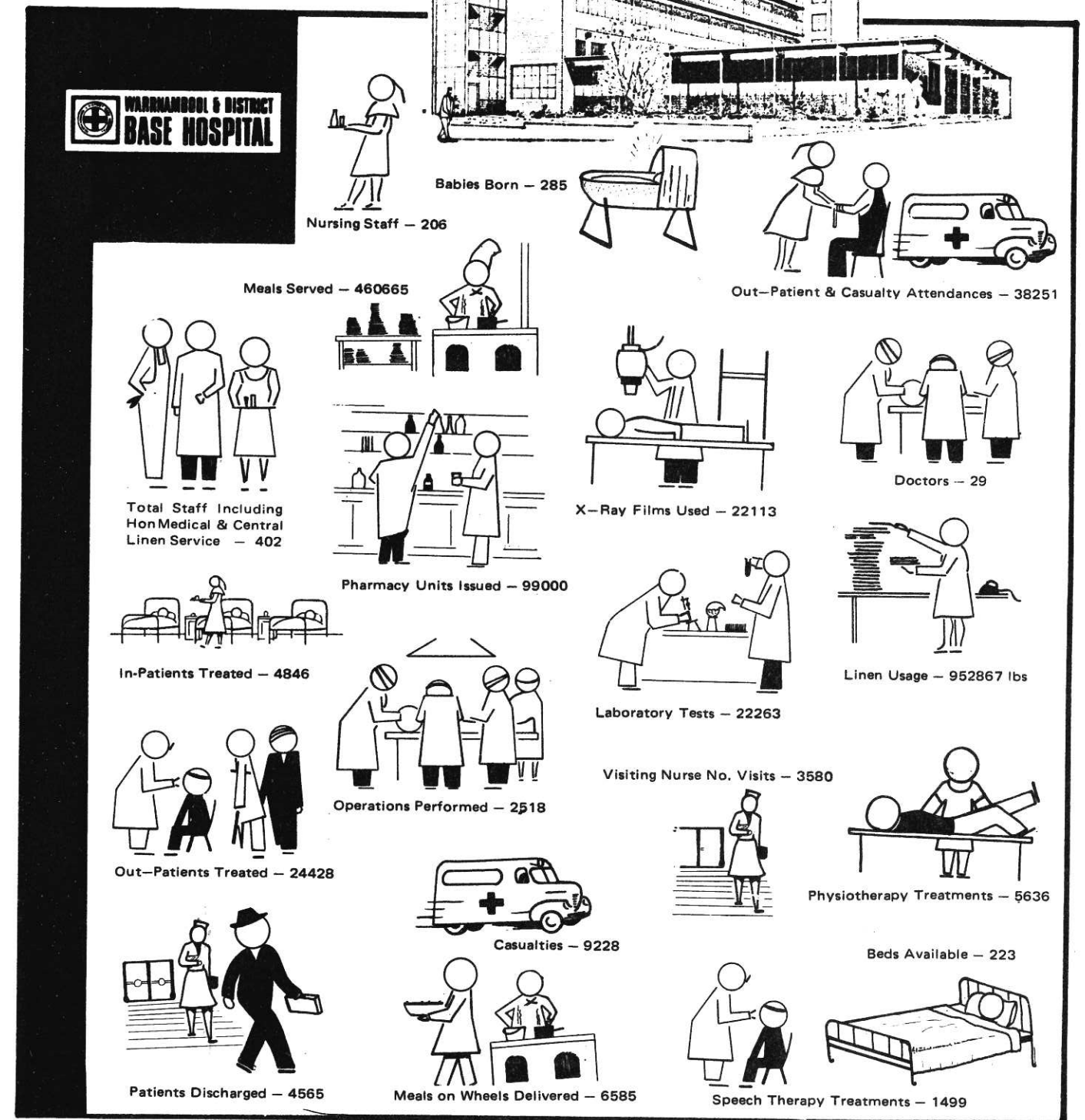

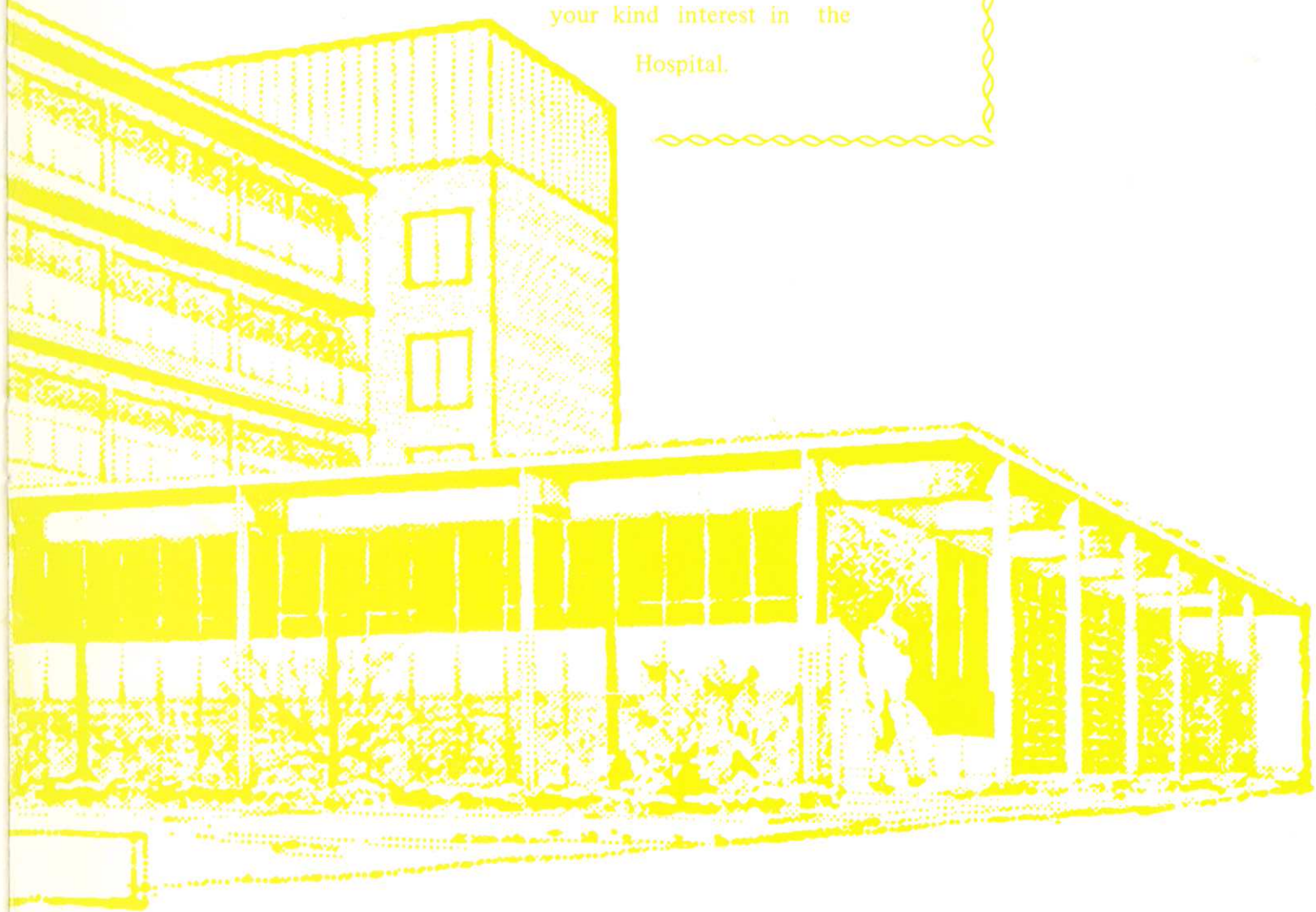
