117th Annual Report, 1970 - 1971

To The Life Governors and Contributors . . .

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I have the honour to present on behalf of the Committee of Management, the 117th Annual Report and Audited Financial Statements for year ended 30th June, 1971. These cover the Base Hospital, Alveston

Such reports present in the main the financial aspects of the Hospitals but statistics are also a vital part. They represent people, and their health problems, and reflect our main objectives in terms of saving lives, relief of suffering and rehabilitation of incapacitated in all age groups.

Change is constant in Hospitals. Not necessarily in physical terms of buildings but in upgrading of treatment standards to meet the challenges and changing conditions of the day.

Staff at various levels gear themselves to educational striving to update knowledge,

BUILDING -

Through limitation of Capital Government finance, the volume of construction and remodelling was reduced from previous years. The highlight has been the completion of the Intensive Care Ward of six beds, built on the western side of the multi-storey building, leading from Surgical floor number 1. This unit is for patients requiring short-term intensive treatment for critical states of illness prior to their transfer to ward units for more prolonged and routine care. This unit is equipped with special electronic equipment for the particular function of continuous patient monitoring so that the exact condition of a patient can be seen at a glance and as a safe-guard, any deterioration triggers an alarm system to alert the Nursing and Medical team.

Other equipment includes a range of respiratory apparatus.

This is a new pattern of Nursing care, so Sisters are in course of training to supervise the skilled attention necessary.

Amongst the many essential constructional requirements of such a department, is a minimum of equipment on the floor, free access around patient bed, surfaces easy to clean and control infection with durable smooth materials, good communications, sound-proof double windows and piped gases for instant need.

The total financial cost of the unit, both construction and equipment is approx. \$96,000 and progress payments at this stage have been advanced locally as Government Grant is not yet available.

No establishment for financial allowance has been made available for increase in Nursing staff, so we have been hampered in opening under the well-planned conditions we had anticipated.

Ward 7 floor tiles, \$1,000.

Kitchen and Cafeteria Evaporative Cooling system.

Repairs to Boiler House roof.

Plastering of wall, Koroit Street frontage.

Extensions to Pathology and Blood Bank.

In addition essential maintenance of all our properties was carried out.



Still in the mind of the Committee for further improvements as funds allow, is the renovation of sections of our Private and Intermediate wing, remodelling of and extensions to the Laundry and also provision of Psychiatric services, concentrating on short-term primary treatments to augment the local facilities for long-stay patients at Brierly Home. Such a link would be a desirable adjunct to our Hospital, and the Hospitals Commission and Mental Hygiene Authority have agreed in principle to the proposal.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT -

The following members retire by effluxion of time but being eligible, submit themselves for re-election:—Messrs, R.G. Bennett, F.P. Callaghan, E. Johnson, J.B. Norton, P.T. Parker.

During the year, we recorded with deep regret the sudden passing of one of our members. Mr. J. McD. Taylor had been a member of the Board for almost 40 years and had occupied positions of President, Treasurer and Honorary Solicitor. His sound advice and contributions to discussion, were always of great value.

As Treasurer, his jealous regard for the proper expenditure of Hospital funds was greatly appreciated. On a personal note, his warm-hearted manner gained affection and respect.

Mr. Donald Jenkins was appointed to the vacancy on the Board for a three year term.

HOSPITALS & CHARITIES COMMISSION -

We are grateful to the Chairman, Dr. J.H. Lindell and his fellow Commissioners and Executive staff for helpful and cordial co-operation during the year. Our requests have met with understanding and a generous policy as far as funds would allow.

HONORARY SERVICES -

The primary and paramount function of any Hospital is, of course, the care of its patients. In this regard our Honorary Medical staff have contributed unstintingly and have given generously of their valuable time and skill. Our Honorary Dentists and Honorary Optometrists likewise joined in this devoted contribution to the health of our Community.

Consultative Clinics on a visiting basis were Peter MacCallum Cancer Clinic, Poliomyelitis, Psychiatric, Ear, Nose and Throat, Oral Surgery and Orthodontic examinations.

It is with deep regret that the Board records the sudden death of Doctor W.G. Miller on the 12th July, 1971. Doctor Miller commenced medical practice at Warrnambool in 1946 and served as Honorary Physician since that date. He was also a Member of the present Advisory Board and had served in this capacity for several years prior to his death. Our most sincere sympathy is extended to Mrs. Miller and family.

VOLUNTARY SERVICES -

Spiritual welfare and well-being of patients has been in the comforting hands of the various denominations and regular contact is maintained by Church representatives.

Warrnambool Red Cross Branches provide library service and Diversional therapy to lessen the tedium for long-stay patients.

Meals on Wheels service is distributed from our Hospital Kitchen daily by voluntary drivers and daily service has reached a high level.

Service Clubs continue their interest in patient welfare and Nestles Social Club and other organizations maintain the spirit of goodwill at Christmas.

FINANCE -

Funds made available for maintenance of Victorian Hospitals cannot meet the needs and capital allocations are also chronically short of demand. Such a situation will surely persist under present formulas. We face a situation which is world-wide in Hospitals when the financial scene is dominated by steep rises, mainly wages and commodity prices beyond the control of Committees. It has to be said, however, that in the Hospital Industry many wage reforms were long overdue and even now in Hospital staffs, nobody is lavishly rewarded by Industry or any other standards, and staffing establishment is understaffed rather than in excess.

Hospitals cannot escape the need to provide service 168 hours per week which includes unsocial hours of night duty and weekends, all now rewarded in any Award by penalty rates but able to be avoided by most Industries. Management of Hospitals cannot introduce any effective automation to match the personal element so necessary to patient care and comfort. Such conditions of shortage of finance cause anxiety and critical reviews of all departments to decide priorities of service as funds permit, in the event of a less favourable future.

The anticipated rise in fees schedule was inevitable but unfortunately it places a disproportionate burden on Country residents with a higher percentage of Private and Intermediate treatments and this will lessen Grant allocations and benefit city Hospitals.

Government benefits through Subsidized Medical Services for persons on low incomes and those unemployed and sick, have proved of some benefit but prove difficult in administration.

Fragmented control of total health services has some disadvantages, and a coherent single voice embracing acute Hospitals in city and country, Mental Institutions, Homes for the Aged, Private Hospitals and allied other services could provide a situation more easily analysed.

In these days of great concern it is difficult to measure performances against budget calculations under conditions of constant change.

Our income was \$1,574,729 and expenditure shown \$1,574,431 showing a surplus of \$298.

STATISTICS -

Daily averages of people under treatment have been rising constantly for some years. The 1971 figure of 169.4 compares with that of 1970, 170.6. Daily averages over five years are shown elsewhere in this report and indicate increasing demand. Surgical and Medical Inpatient accommodation is frequently overtaxed. It must be understood that sections of beds are set aside for Infectious diseases, children, Midwifery, T.B., and cannot be available for general use.

Number of patients treated from 4.846 to 4.961.

Outpatient and Casualty attendances increased from 38,251 to 49,028. This includes some Pathology and X-Ray patient care. Operations performed were, Major 884, Minor 739, and Casualty 1,083, Corio Daily Average — 46.66 (47 beds), Alveston Daily Average — 32.69 (33 beds).

HOSPITAL OF THE YEAR 1970 -

The Executive of the Country Hospitals Association conducted a contest for the Country Hospital of the

Year.
It was conducted under five classes of Hospitals and Homes with particular emphasis on communications, food services, public relations and staff relations with judges well versed in each field.

Judges placed Warrnambool first in its class with Wangaratta second and Geelong 3rd. In the overall choice of Hospital of the year, Warrnambool and Healesville (who won the under 50 bed class) were placed equal first and Awards were presented by the Minister of Health, the Hon, J. Rossiter.







BURSARIES -

Only by granting Bursaries can Country Base Hospitals achieve staff security and we have two Physiotherapy students, and one Medical Record Librarian student in training. One of the greatest problems faced in rural areas is to attract suitably qualified, motivated young people to Hospital calling to ensure a continuity of staffing in Paramedical departments.

AUXILIARIES -

Each year the Committee is pleased to pay its tribute to the excellent work of our ten Auxiliaries. Each is enthusiastic and loyal and carries out the self-imposed task of raising finance to purchase important equipment. Without their aid, such purchases would be beyond the capacity of the Hospital, and such gifts benefit patients for many years to come. It allows the Hospital Medical and Nursing staff to provide advanced methods of treatment. Some district financial recession has made the task of finance raising more difficult but considerable activity has been apparent.

We regretted that the Grasmere/Cooramook Auxiliary decided to disband during the year and we express appreciation of eleven years of loyal support.

Total raised by our Auxiliaries was \$6,867 and this permitted the purchase of equipment to the value of \$13,735. Part of this was raised in a Combined Fete in Warrnambool which raised \$731, and other city and district activity of varied nature raised the balance.

EQUIPMENT -

Much equipment has been added during the year, Anaesthetic Machines, \$1,100, Dental Chair \$672, Alarm Monitor for babies \$168, Humidifier \$715, 9 Medicine Trolleys each \$94, Communication Radio Paging \$902, Epidiascope Nurses School \$376, Dangerous Drug Safe \$364, Mark 7 Bird Respirator—(donated by local Asthma Committee), Blue-line Water flotation mattresses, Hi-Lo beds, Alroh Lawn Edger \$107, and in the Laundry a new Tumbler, Folding machine and Air Compressors.

CARE OF THE AGED -

Total community demand for Aged patient care has not decreased and our waiting list for beds is a large one. When Lyndoch Hostel secures its planned construction it will fill a long-felt need.

Alveston and Corio Homes have 80 beds and wards 4, 6 and 7 have a constant bed occupancy of an additional 70 patients. Acute beds in other wards also have their complement of aged and handicapped and the rate of transfer is very slow.

Domiciliary care, where we reach out of the Hospital into patients Homes, has the advantage that it allows aged persons to retain full dignity and independence. Service has been enlarged by establishing a second Visiting Nurse service but this has limitations and is only a feasible solution when the patient has relatives at home. In some cases this is not so, and an admission to an Institution the only solution even if a second-best substitute to one's own home. All Homes in Victoria are concerned at Waiting lists exceeding 7,000 persons, 75% of which is female, for infirmary patients. Limited service only can be given to other Corangamite areas. Our region has some 70,000 residents of whom approx., 12% are aged. This is a matter for concern.

Even in the long-stay "young adult" group where injury damage is irreversible and beyond home care, bed availability is still an unsolved problem.

In addition to staff care and efficiency, voluntary groups including Service clubs, Fletcher Jones Social Club, Church groups, give outstanding support in comfort for long-term care patients.

At Corio, Hopkins Apex Club Working Bee in the grounds of the Home was much appreciated. Also large trees in the grounds have been severely lopped and pathways constructed. At Alveston, additional toilet facilities constructed, financed from Government Grant and the local share met by Fletcher Jones staff donation. Kerbs and guttering have been remodelled as part of a city reconstruction programme.





REGIONAL SCHEME -

The linking of Hospitals to attract certain services, giving opportunity to improve patient care to all residents however remote geographically, has been established in eleven Regions for sixteen years. Our activity is the Corangamite region, centered at Warrnambool Base Hospital.

During this year a pilot scheme has been created to further concentrate interest throughout Victoria by linking the eleven Regions into five Zones.

Our area centres with the purpose of fostering mutual interesting objectives between Barwon (Geelong), Corangamite (Warrnambool), Glenelg (Hamilton), respectively under the title of Zone Number 5. There is no direct pressure on Hospitals or Medical Practitioners to participate in this scheme but it has many aspects showing merit for better patient care.

In promoting the pilot scheme for 1971, several meetings have been held to study a formula towards improved Paediatric care also uniformity upon the essential ingredients in Medical Records.

COMPUTERS -

For the past 2½ years, we have been processing Medical Records information through the memory bank computer at Monash University. This has enabled us to extract a considerable volume of statistics, classified, sorted and summarized beyond the capacity of our staff Miss Barbara Armstrong (Medical Records Librarian) to handle manually. We have improved transcription by installing a Telex system for transmission daily and also retrieval of information.

Wider fields for speedier results are being explored but it is a slow and complex operation. Statistics are now well advanced, and an early start will be made on Pay-roll compilation followed by other Accountancy and financial data.

LIFE GOVERNORS -

At the last Annual meeting the Committee honoured the following for signal service in the interest of our patients by electing them Life Governors:—

INTERESTING ITEMS ON DISPLAY -

The family of the late Dr. W.D. Saltau presented to the Hospital the C.B.E. decoration awarded to his father the late Hon. Marcus Saltau, C.B.E., M.L.C., in 1945. Also the gold key presented to Dr. W.D. Saltau when opening the Jean Buick Maternity ward in 1928 to commemorate his Mother. These are displayed in Marcus Saltau House named in Marcus Saltau's honour recognising 42 years on the Committee including 30 years as President.



ADMINISTRATION -

Mr. S.A. Lindsay our Manager & Secretary continues to administer the Hospital in a very capable and efficient manner. A Base Hospital is a complex organization with technical experts in many fields such as Surgery, Medicine, Pathology, Radiology, Physiotherapy, Nurse Training, other experts in service functions, such as Catering, Engineering, Housekeeping, Cleaning, The Laundry, Administration and other Miscellaneous Services. It is a credit to Mr. Lindsay that all of these people work so well together to make our Hospital as efficient as it is, and to have this acknowledged by the Country Hospitals Association in placing Warrnambool First in its class in Hospital of the Year 1970.

On behalf of the Board of Management I would like to thank Mr. Lindsay.

Dr. J.D. Reid, Medical Superintendent has again maintained excellent liaison with Medical staff and administration. The goodwill which exists is in no small measure due to his unfailing courtesy and efficiency, and he is held in highest esteem both by the Committee and his colleagues. It is fitting that in his administration, which also covers Pathology services and Infections Committee, the welfare of the patient is paramount and every effort made to promote highest achievable standards in patient care.

Miss J. Stewart, Matron makes a major contribution in the maintaining of high standards in Nursing care. General and Nursing Aide Training Schools have highly satisfactory results in examinations reflecting the efficiency of theoretical Tutoring, and practical training. Recruitment has been maintained at a high level, which is satisfactory as the Nursing Profession faces competition from many other sources seeking the same talents.

Changes in procedure must follow the introduction of the new Curriculum for basic General Training which is planned to provide a better prepared Nurse. Miss Stewart has joined Committees planning the changed nature and wider scope of the training programme.

The Committee also records appreciation for loyal and effective services by Assistant Manager - Mr. A.E.W. Matthews, Deputy Matron - Miss K. Taylor, Assistant Matron - Sister W. Hawker, Accountant - Mr. S.G. Hando, Chief Clerk - Mrs. M. McDonough also Executive Department Heads upon whom considerable responsibility for patients welfare rests.

Three members of the Administration staff are continuing at various stages, the six year Bachelor of Health Administration external course at the University of N.S.W., namely Mr. S.G. Hando — Accountant, Mr. T.C. Jacobs — Paymaster and Mr. G.C. Gleason — Administrative Assistant. Mr. Hando spent 1970 at the University of N.S.W., telescoping two years study into one and our duties as Accountant were carried out by Mr. Ivan Stanway of the Hospitals Commission relieving staff.

MEDICAL ANCILLARY DEPARTMENTS -

X—Ray: Dr. A.T. Park retired after 22 years as Radiologist. Appreciation was expressed at his farewell gathering in March for valuable services rendered to patients. Dr. E.B. Rafferty was appointed to the position in March 1971. Demand for this service is on the increase so we are planning some modified internal construction. We have ordered a modern Major Plant which we hope to instal late in 1971, replacing an older unit 22 years old.

Pathology: There is increasing need shown by the volume of investigations in routine patient diagnosis, controls during treatment, and special investigations. New techniques are constantly coming forward both in range, speed and accuracy of result. This large staff headed by Mr. G. O'Brien and Mr. K. Piper require additional work areas when such a construction is found possible.

Other departments have also shown increases in work load such as Physiotherapy, (Mr. J. Grace and Mrs. M. Page) and Speech Therapy (Miss Sue West and Miss Jan Carter), where treatments have maintained a high level at the Base Hospital. The Speech Therapists also visit Timboon one day weekly.

Ante-Natal Clinic and T.B. Clinic continued their services during the year.

SERVICE DEPARTMENTS -

An Annual Report would be incomplete without reference to the loyal and valued contribution of department Executives, Engineering (Mr. W.A. Bedggood), Catering (Mr. F.J. Kelly), Domestic Supervisor (Mrs. J. Horwood), Laundry Supervisor (Mr. R. Earl), each control departments carrying considerable responsibility towards patient care.

LEGACIES -

Of a special note, legacies from the Estates of Mr. S. Buchanan — \$1,000, Mr. D. Paton — \$500 to Corio, Estate of Florence and Truby Williams — \$400 and R.M. Naylor \$200.

APPEALS -

As in past years the Management and staff of 3YB spared no effort or enthusiasm to ensure the success of the 1971 Appeal. The district total raised was a record of \$65,660 of which the Base Hospital received \$27,186, Alveston \$2,233 and Corio \$1,437.

Dr. R. Peterson became Medical Officer at Brierly Hospital, Warrnambool.


Dr. M. Page, Dr. R. Hutley and Dr. G. Stewart were appointed Junior R.M.O's.


